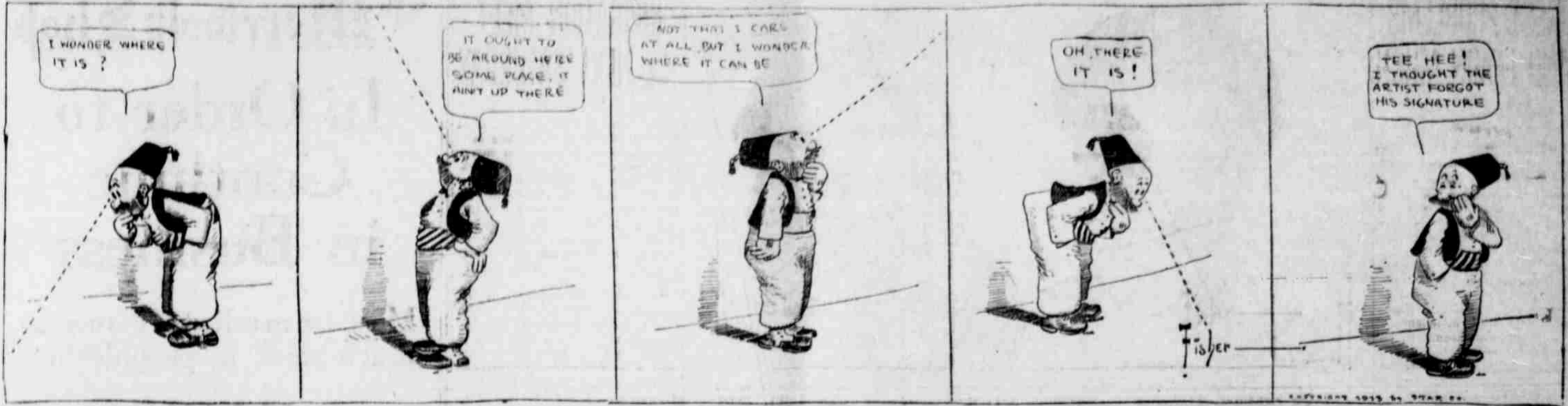


Jeff Was Scared Until He Found It
