

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

other than in the performance of their official duties they must make a verified statement showing time of absence during said month.

No. 2. The county court under section No. 937 Lords Oregon laws is authorized to provide all books, stationery and other supplies for sheriff, county clerk and treasurer, or other county officers and will not pay for any such supplies unless purchased by said county court.

No. 3. All deputies employed in county offices who handle money for the county must be approved by the county court.

No. 4. The county treasurer is hereby ordered to keep a general road fund and shall credit and keep separate all taxes levied by the county court for general road purposes.

No. 5. The county treasurer is ordered to keep a sheriff's daily cash book in which he will enter the amount received by him from the sheriff each day and will receipt the sheriff for such amounts as they are paid in.

No. 6. Road supervisors will do work upon county roads except when ordered by the county court, who will in accordance with section 6278 of Lords Oregon laws prescribe the methods and manner of working the same, and of expending the tax apportioned to their several districts.

No. 7. It being ordered that the Mail Tribune and the Sun be made the official papers.

No. 8. Ordered that all under sheriffs, constables, justices of peace report at once any insane persons, or any person liable to become a county charge, coming to their notice, in their respective districts.
