ELECTION CALLED FOR MARCH 22

The city council met in special session Wednesday evening and called a special election for March 22 to vote on a bond issue of \$20,000 for the erection of an armory in this city, and on an amendment limiting the mayor's power of suspension.

Charter Amendment. Section 72-b. In addition to all warrants and bonds authorized to be issued by sections 72 and 72-a of this charter, the council of the City of Medford is hereby further authorized and empowered to borrow money on the faith of said city and for that purpose to issue warrants and bonds in the manner provided by section 72 of this charter for the sole purpose of obtaining the necessary funds to aid in the erection, building and construction of a State Armory in the City of Medford, and for the purchase of a building site therefor. But the total amount of the indebtedness incurred and the bonds issued pursuant to this section shall not exceed \$20,000.

Section 72-a. The following is the form in which the foregoing measure will appear upon the ballot: Special Election March 22nd, 1913. Mark between number and answer voted for. Submitted by order of the city council. Charter amendment; vote "yes" or "no."

Section 9. The mayor may appoint, subject to the approval of a majority of the council, one City Attorney, one City Engineer, one Chief of Police, one Street Commissioner, one Market Master, and such other police officers and other city employees as are required and he may suspend at any time any or all of such officers until the next regular meeting of the city council. At any regular meeting of the council by a majority vote may at any time remove any officer named in this section, except the mayor, providing, however, that the said mayor shall not have the power to make more than one suspension of any officer or employee of said city during his term of office except for misconduct and upon written charges, a copy of which shall be served upon the person so suspended and which shall be served upon the person so suspended and which shall be submitted to the council at its next regular meeting thereafter. In the absence or inability to act, of both the mayor and chairman of the council, the recorder, when emergency exists, may appoint additional police officers to assist the established police force in maintaining the peace of said city but no such appointment shall be made for a longer time than forty-eight hours.

Section 9. The mayor may appoint, subject to the approval of a majority of the council, one City Attorney, one City Engineer, one Chief of Police, one Street Commissioner, one Market Master, and such other police officers and other city employees as are required and he may suspend at any time any or all of such officers until the next regular meeting of the city council.
