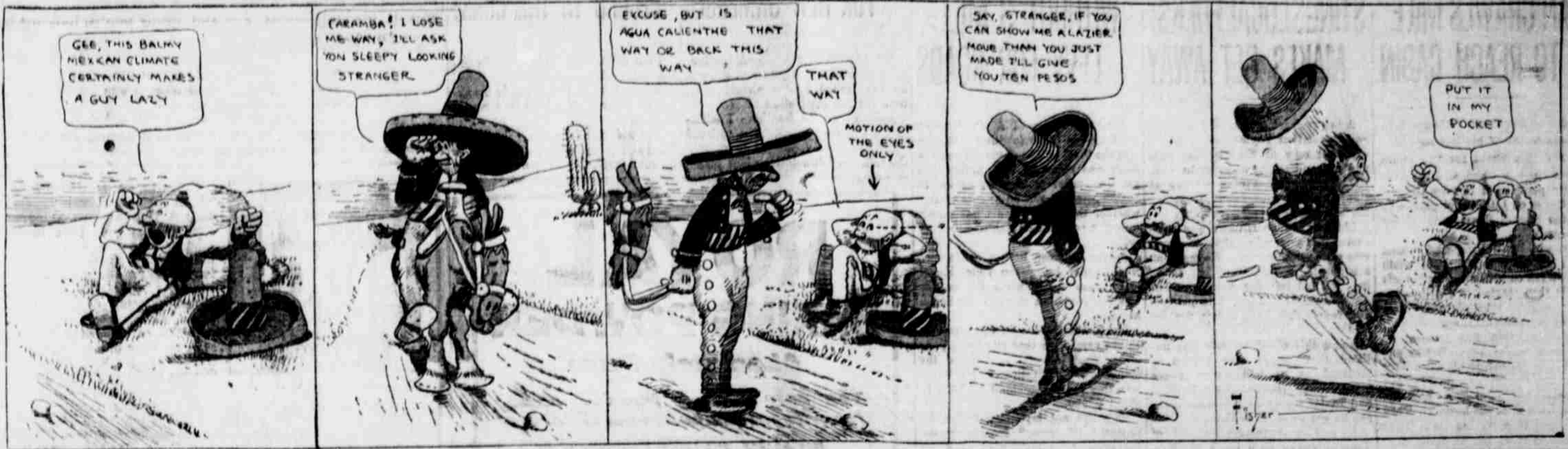

BOURNE HOPEFUL FOR CRATER LAKE

Senator Jonathan Bourne Jr. has sent the following letter: WASHINGTON, D. C., March 7.—Mail Tribune, Medford, Oregon: Gentlemen: As soon as the sundry civil bill had passed both houses at 3 o'clock in the morning, March 4, I wired you the gratifying result so far as Crater Lake was concerned. Later in the day President Taft vetoed the bill and during the last hour of the session when the senate was ready to pass the bill over the president's veto Senator Poindeexter of Washington talked the bill to death. This situation makes it a little embarrassing to answer your telegram of appreciation of my efforts, and yet I feel that you will not charge the ultimately result up to myself or any member of the delegation. As you said in your telegram, this placed Crater Lake on the map so far as congressional recognition is concerned and there is no doubt in my mind that the sundry civil bill will be passed at the special session in the same form as at the regular session.
