## **GREEKS SEIZE** GERMAN VESSEL IN AEGEAN SEA

Warships Grab Steamer Irmingard Off Island of Lemanos-No Reason for Capture Given-Diplomats Summoned Home From Vacations.

Armed Operations Against Montenegro by Austrian Navy Expected-Ultimatum Sent Latter Country.

LONDON, March 22.-Alarming disputches of the seizure by Greek warships of the German steamer Irmingard off the island of Lemanos in the Aegean sea were received here today. No reason for her capture is given and diplomats here are making frantic efforts to get further details The Irmingard sailed from Barry Wales, for Genoa February 28.

Dispatches from Berlin say the foreign office there has learned that armed operations against Montenegro by the Austrian mayy may be expected soon. The Austrian squadron to now maneuvering off the Albanian and Montenegrin coasts. Other reports from Vienna stated that the Austrian government has addressed a strongly worded note, amounting practically to an ultimatum, to Mon-
