She is alleged to have divorced Gerbart to marry L. W. Kellog, a negro butler in the Gerhart home.

Until her marriage to the negro, Mrs. Gerhart was prominent in St. Louis society.

According to Mrs. Cox, she often displayed her license to wed the negro and once exclaimed: "I do not care what becomes of me. I wish I were dead, for everyone knows 1 am married to a negro." Kellog admitted at the wellmitted at the police station today that he was married to Mrs. Gerhart.

COUNTESS MONTIGNOSO DENIES NEWSPAPER STORIES; COULD BE HAPPY IN AN ATTIC IF SHE HAD HER SON

The Countess Montigneso has denied most emphatically the fantastic stories of her affairs published recently in European newspapers. The Countess, who is living quietly at Brussels, has regained her health and attractive appearance and looks young, as she is no longer disturbed by her husband, being legally separated

The Countess declared she has not written a word of the libretto of her husband's opera, has no intention of retiring to a castle in Austria or a convent in Italy; has not tried to commit suicide, has not been received again into the Church and has come to Florence only to see "According to the newspapers," she went on, "I have

committed suicide five times, been married ten times in two years—to an Italian officer, to a Florence engineer, to a French aviator, to an American millionnaire, to an Austrian count, to a professor of philology, to a Polish count, to a tenor, to a Russian nobleman and to a German lawyer.

The Countess Monrignoso was the Princess Louise of Saxony, wife of the Crown Prince, when she was di-vocced by him in February, 1903. He has since suc-ceeded to the throne of Saxony. There are six chil-dren, three sons and three daughters, the youngest of whom, Princess Anna Monica, was born in May, 1963, after her mother's rupture with the Crown Prince. The title of Countess Montignoso was given to the Princess after the dicorce. In 1997 she was married to Enrico Toselli in London. She obtained a legal separation from
