Czar Said to Be Secretly Aiding King Nicholas in His Defiance of the Powers-Austria Expects to Act Independently, if Allies Fall

Servia Supports Montenegro — Balkans Ignore Orders From Powers and Continue Attack on Scutari

LONDON, April 4.-Flat charges by Austrian editors that Russia is behind Montenegro's defiance to the powers is made in the Austrian capital today, according to despatches received here this afternoon. Although Russia agreed to the united plan for the coercion of Montenegro, the Vienna editors allege that the Czar is secretly aiding King Nicholas.

All Vienna newspapers, the despatches say, print an apparently inpired declaration announcing that Austria-Hungary expects to act independently against Montenegro if the powers' naval demonstration proves insufficient. Servia's support if Montenegro also is causing alarm
