MORGAN LEAVES MILLLIONS TO SON **BEQUESTS ARE FEW**

NEW YORK, April 21.- The will of the late J. Pierpont Morgan, the New York financier, who died recently in Rome, was filed for probate in the surrogates court here today. J P. Morgan Jr. declined to comment on the provisions of the will.

J. P. Morgan Jr. and his sisters waived citation and the will probably will be probated tomorrow. The oaths of the executors already have been filed. The petition does not state the value of the estate, merely declaring that its value "exceeds POLICE GRAFT

SPEEDY ACTION NECESSARY.

TTENTION is called to the letter printed elsewhere written by R. K. Neill, vice-president of the Rogue River Canal Company. It is proof enough that speedy action is needed if we wish to inaugurate an era of prosperity and development in the valley.

While he minimizes the present productivity and possibilities, and quotes the only shipper in the valley that attempts to market culls as fruit, in the main he states the truth. The trouble with the valley is that the balance of trade is against it for lack of sufficient production, due not only to young orchards not being in bearing, but to lack of irrigation.

If you want prosperity, get busy and help bring it.
