

M'GAW PLANS FOR MEDFORD DAY AT GREAT CONFERENCE

Yesterday was World's Christian Citizenship Conference day among the local churches. Under the auspices of the ministerial union of the city, Dr. James S. McGaw, of Pittsburgh, Pa., addressed three large audiences. He spoke in the Christian church in the morning, addressed a mass meeting of the citizens in the Methodist Episcopal church in the afternoon and a union meeting of the churches in the Presbyterian church in the evening.

Dr. McGaw is general field secretary of the Second World's Christian Citizenship conference, which is to be held in Portland June 29 to July 6 of this year.

Epoch Making Assembly.
Said Dr. McGaw: "This assembly will in every way be an epoch making event. What the Ecumenical council at Edinburgh was in missions, this will be in citizenship. It will present the greatest aggregation of speakers that ever assembled under one roof for the discussion of citizenship. Seventy-five to 100 men of national and international reputation, men from every country in Europe, from China, Japan and Korea, from Canada and almost every state in the union, chosen because of their exact knowledge and experience in the subject upon which they shall speak."

"Among the subjects to be discussed are marriage and divorce, social purity, moral training in public education, prison reform, society's delinquents, a weekly day of rest, the liquor problem, capital and labor, international peace, and child labor."

"Delegates from all churches, reform organizations and associations for public betterment are being appointed. Thousands will be in attendance from all over America."

"Medford congregations and other organizations having a Christian or patriotic purpose are to send a strong delegation. But Medford day at the conference is also being arranged for. Special admission tickets for the conference on that day will be supplied by the management at Portland and Medford will receive a welcome."

Large Committee.
"The Portland Commercial club has a committee of 100 of the representative citizens which will have in charge the entertainment of the guests while in the city. The Fourth of July celebration to be held this year in Portland in connection with the conference will be unique. It will be a real anniversary of American independence. Foreign speakers will join with Americans in the addresses in the morning of that day. This will be followed by a civic parade different from any ever seen in America and which will present a careful study of the folk lore and American traditions, together with the institutions dear to all Americans."

"The conference has been indorsed by almost every church. It is receiving the hearty cooperation of all public spirited citizens throughout the union. Careful work in organization and publicity has been done for the last three years and everything spells success for the great world gathering."

"Among some of the results sought in the conference are the awakening of the public conscience to the pressing problems which confront us, the presentation of the Bible solution for those problems, the consolidation of Christian forces for human betterment, the production of an exact report of conditions and the creation of a new literature on civic uplift and, finally, a possibility of economy in the administration of social betterment efforts."

SUFFRAGE IS NOT RELIGIOUS QUESTION DECLARES LEADER

NEW YORK, April 21.—A bomb was exploded in suffrage and Catholic circles today when a statement was published setting forth that Miss Inez Milholland, famous suffrage leader, had made a direct attack on the Catholic church as being opposed to votes for women.

The trouble started at the Hotel Plaza, when a woman in an audience addressed by Miss Milholland asked if it were true that the Catholics opposed suffrage. Reference was made to the statement issued by Cardinal Gibbons, following the visit paid him by the on-to-Washington hikers, in which the cardinal expressed views in opposition to votes for women.

In a statement dictated to the United Press today Miss Milholland said: "My intentions were and are to attack no institution of personal arrangements, except the ones that prevent the full and free play of democracy. That is, the arrangement by which women are excluded from the exercise of the right to vote. I explored the fact that the Catholic church forbade access to any source of information whatsoever, as it necessarily must, by placing any book upon The Index. The priest that I spoke to agrees to with holding of informing is a regrettable thing. He maintained that the Catholic church could hold its own with the breath of all the sciences in the world blown upon it, and he gave me a book to prove his point which I believe is called 'The Popes and the Sciences.' He maintained that information about everything added to and did not detract from the integrity of the Catholic church. Therefore he believed, too, in votes for women. That type of Catholic who offered opposition in the towns of Wisconsin was the one who believed that suffrage for women meant knowledge for women and rebellion for women. I doubt if any explanation would be necessary if I had a shorthand report of my remarks, but perhaps I garbled my meaning and failed to make it clear."

Miss Milholland was asked if she was displeased at the action of Cardinal Gibbons in opposing suffrage. "Certainly not," she replied. "He had the same right to be opposed to votes for women that I have not to be a member of the Catholic church. There is no argument between the church and the suffrage workers. It is a matter of individual opinion on the part of the Catholics, just as it is a matter of individual opinion on the part of members of any other church."

On clean-up day the street cleaning department will collect all of the trash gathered by citizens on their residence lots and haul it away. The only condition is that it be placed in sacks or boxes and on the curb. When collected by the department it will be hauled to Riverside and Twelfth streets, where it will be placed in a huge pile and burned.

RAID ON CHINESE ROOMINGHOUSE NETS 30 TINS OF OPIUM

A raid by officers headed by Sheriff August D. Singler on all of the Chinese rooming houses in the county Sunday night netted thirty tins of opium and a considerable quantity of milder preparations of dope. Jim Ling and one or two other Chinamen were caught in the raid.

All of the opium found by the officers was at Ashland. The raid at Medford did not net any of the drug, but as the rooming houses at Ashland were first raided it is believed that local Chinamen were warned by telephone and had time to hide any of the drug they might have had on hand.

Jim Ling who was caught in the net at Ashland figured in a stabbing affray in this city some months ago. At that time the laundry and rooming house conducted by Wo Lee on Riverside was raided but no opium was found. Since then one or two raids were made but nothing found.

It has been reported frequently that Ashland was a distributing center for this section for the opium trade among the Chinese. This led to the raiding of the rooming houses there first.

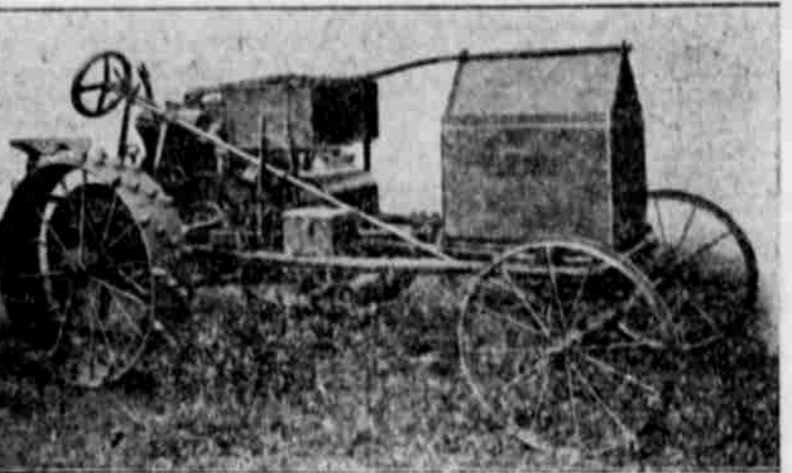
