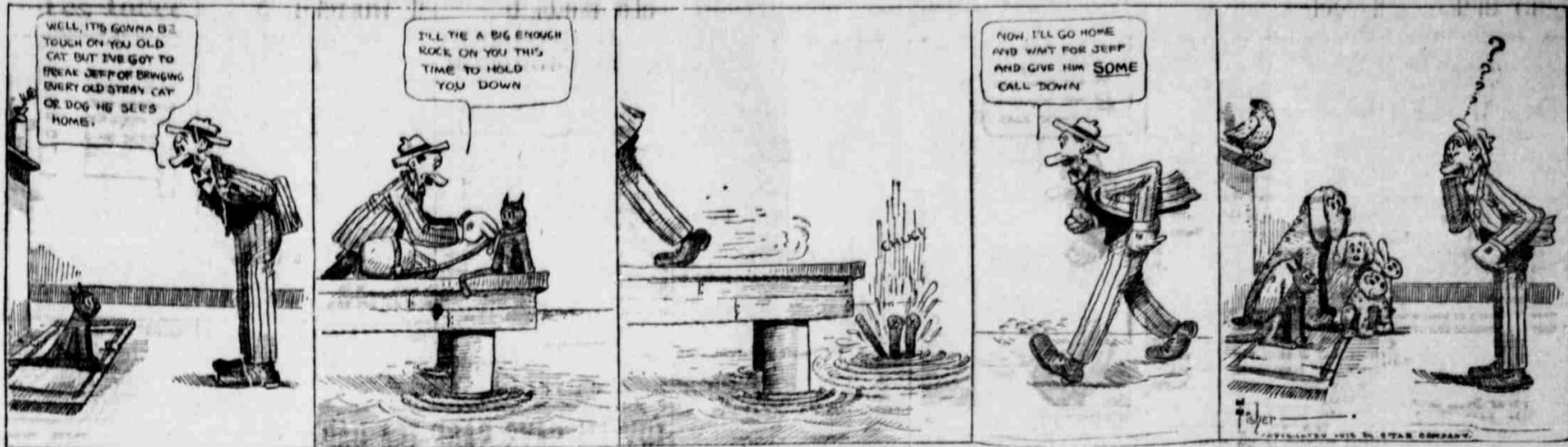

BREMERTON, Wash., May 2.—Pointing out that the Oregon is the only battleship on the Pacific Coast today the Pacific Naval Monthly, published here today, which unofficially expresses the wishes of the officers and men of the Pacific fleet, calls on the government to maintain a battleship fleet in the Pacific in its May number. The editorial says in part:
