RESOLUTION ORDERING IMPROVEMENT

Be it resolved by the City Council of Medford:

Whereas, the City Council has duly declared its intention by resolution to improve the following street, to-wit: The alley through Block 5A, Original Townsite, from Grape street to Holly street, by placing concrete curbs and gutters on both sides thereof and paving the same with asphalt concrete pavement, consisting of a four inch asphalt concrete base and a 1 1/2 inch asphalt wearing surface.

And whereas notice thereof was duly given as required by the charter of said city; and

Whereas, protest against the same has been duly considered, the Council orders the improvement to be made, as described in said resolution, and the amount of the cost thereof assessed upon the property especially benefited thereby.

ORDINANCE NO. 750

An ordinance to regulate the putting down of sidewalks and keeping the same on grade upon the streets of the City of Medford, Oregon.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation

to lay down, build or construct any permanent sidewalk in or upon any of the streets of the city of Medford, Oregon, without first having filed with the City Engineer of said city an application for permission to construct such sidewalk, and without having first received from the City Engineer written permission to construct such sidewalk. Such application must be signed by the person, firm, or officer or agent, if a corporation, of such corporation desiring to construct such sidewalk, and shall show the name of the street and the lot or property abutting the same. Upon such application the City Engineer shall issue the applicant, free of charge, a written permit to construct such sidewalk.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the Mayor of said city, be punished by a fine not less than \$5 and not more than \$25, and in default of the payment of such fine shall be imprisoned in the city jail one day for each \$2 of such fine.
