



Section 9. Any person who builds a camp fire upon lands within this state, not his own, without clearing 'the ground immediately around it free from material which will carry fire, or who leaves thereon a camp fire burning and unattended, or who permits a camp fire to spread thereon, or who uses in any fire arms discharged thereon other than incumbustible gunwadding, shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25), nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500).




