PUBLIC NUISANCES

THERE are a number of champion mossback obstructionists clogging the wheels of progress in Oregon, who ought to be run out of the state as public nuisances.

Chief among these professional obstructionists is L. H. McMahon, an attorney of Salem who is too narrow to appreciate the benefit of development in any section except his own and evidently would have all the state money spent in Salem.

McMahon succeeded in blocking the construction of a state highway to Crater Lake, the courts holding with him that making accessible Oregon's greatest natural wonder and opening to travel a natural park where the government is spending millions, was a local affair.

McMahon succeeded in blocking the construction of needed bridges in Portland for years, but finally lost out. He recently attempted to overthrow the commission charter recently voted by the people of Portland but was thrown out of court.

MEDFORD IN GOOD FINANCIAL SHAPE.

THE report of Expert Accountant W. H. Wann filed this week shows that the city of Medford is in excellent financial condition and is a tribute to the efficiency of the Canon administration.

The financial standing of the city shows solvency of \$178,178. Its resources total \$731,935 and consist of water system, \$500,000; water system extensions, \$42,236; real estate, \$135,700; fire apparatus, \$10,000; engineers instruments, \$1,750; street machinery and tools, \$5,000; furniture and fixtures, \$990; cash on hand, \$36,259.

Price will sell one article, and a quality talk is equally strong with another. The fact that price is higher than a cheaper grade is no argument why it should be omitted.

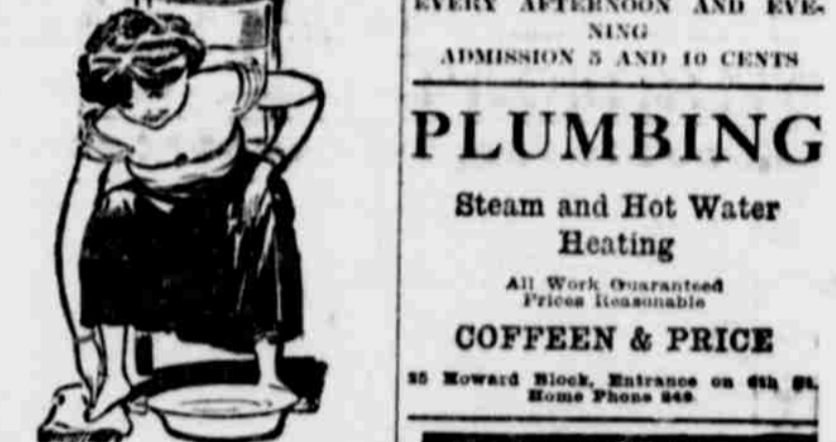
