OBITUARY

Reuben P. Daw. Born at Hapland, Cal., on February 21, 1865. Age at time of death, 48 years 3 months and 6 days. He lived the early part of his life in California and came to Medford in 1895. On October 25, 1896, he married Miss May Johnston, daughter of Mrs. M. M. Johnston and sister of Mrs. W. T. Shoults. To this union were born six children, four boys and two girls, Jack, Cyril, Lawrence, Theodore, Loretta and Vivian, all of whom were with him in his last sickness. Just two weeks before his death he was taken with pneumonia and then typhoid fever, and everything that willing and loving hands could do was done, but of no avail, and he answered the last call and passed beyond our gaze to his eternal home. He leaves besides his wife and children, three brothers and three sisters, a host of friends who mourn with them in this their sad bereavement.

Mrs. Mary Louise Stanley. Steadily, but surely, the grim reaper is severing the ties that bind the pioneer days of Oregon to the present. One by one the adventurers to the shores of the "Sundown Sea" and their descendants bow submissively to the inevitable edict and pass on.

Mrs. Mary Louise Stanley died at Eugene, Ore., May 31, and was buried in the family plot at Ashland, on the 24 day of June, at the age of 59 years. She was the eldest daughter of Colonel John E. Ross and was the first white girl baby born in the town of Jacksonville, and the second white child born in Jackson county, Oregon. Colonel John E. Ross was a pioneer of 1844 and has an enviable record as an Indian fighter and public spirited promoter of progress in Rogue River valley. He was the father of 10 children, of whom the following sisters and brothers of Mrs. Stanley are still living, to-wit: Mrs. J. E. Reams, Klamath Falls, Ore.; Mrs. A. R. Davis, San Francisco, Cal.; Mrs. Adelaide Phelps, Paisley, Ore.; Mrs. Mildred Cunningham, Oakland, Cal.; George B. Ross, Thomas B. Ross, and John E. Ross, Jr., all of Central Point, Ore. Mrs. Stanley's immediate family consisted of six children, as follows: Mrs. Winnifred Hildreth, Ashland, Ore.; Mrs. Helen R. Marks, Eugene; George C. Stanley, Eugene; Mrs. Margaret Schaefer, Gervais; Mrs. Elizabeth Klum (deceased), and Lewis F. Stanley, Portland. All of the living members of the immediate

family were present at the last sad rites. Mrs. Stanley and W. J. Stanley were married December 13, 1871, and Mr. Stanley survives her. Mr. Stanley, in the early '70s, was county school superintendent of Jackson county and for many years was active in county and state politics. For 25 years Mrs. Stanley has been a resident of Ashland and her death is keenly felt here by scores of friends, some of whom, including the writer, have known her from her girlhood days, and all testify to her superior qualities and character. Many a sickroom has been cheered by her presence and her ministrations could always be depended on to relieve distress. Naturally of a very quiet and placid disposition her hand and voice were indices to her kindly soul. Never obtrusive nor complaining, her waning health was not suspected except by her immediate family. A woman of the pre-ent motherly affections, her love and solicitude for her children and her constant application to the affairs of an orderly life occupied her time and commanded the love and respect of all who knew her. Mrs. Stanley was an exceptionally well equipped woman, intellectually and morally, to be the mother and mentor of a family that worshiped her and this respected and loved center of many friends.

A woman of quiet demeanor and dignified manner, she was the embodiment of pure unselfishness and earnest solicitude for the welfare of those about her. The world is made better by the presence of such women and in the hurrying scenes of life tears and roses are appropriately dedicated in this blessed month of May to the memory of one who has passed on but has left the fragrance of a sweet personality that will continue to live and bear fruit.
