

### PROVISIONS NEW CURRENCY BILL MADE PUBLIC

WASHINGTON, June 20.—The administration currency bill was made public last night by Representative Glass, chairman of the house committee on banking and currency.

It will be introduced in the house and senate after Wilson has delivered in person his address to congress Monday.

An outline of the measure prepared by Glass stated it will be gone over in detail for alterations and sets out that its purpose is to accomplish three principal objects.

First—Provision of a means for rediscounting commercial paper of specified types.

Second—A basis for elastic notes properly safeguarded.

Third—Machinery for doing foreign banking business.

The measure provides for twelve or more federal reserve banks which will rediscount paper, deal in government securities, exchange and conduct the government fiscal operations.

National banks and state banks and trust companies as conform to standards would be stockholders of the reserve banks.

The government would hold no stock. The government would control the federal reserve banks, however, through a federal reserve board of seven members in which the banks would have no representation.

The board would be composed of the secretary of the treasury, secretary of agriculture, and comptroller of currency as members ex-officio.

Four other members would be chosen by the president and confirmed by the senate.

The national bank note circulation would remain undisturbed and no proposal is made in the bill for retiring approximately \$700,000,000 two per cent bonds upon which that note issue now rests.

An amendment or separate bill to refund those bonds into three per cent bonds may be introduced later.

### BANK ROBBER BLUFFS POSSE OFF FOR COAST

ROSEBURG, Ore., June 20.—Sheriff Quine and his deputies, together with Detective Stason of Portland, today are preparing a new sortie against Ray Diamond, the young man who fled into the mountains after the robbery of the Glendale State bank, of nearly \$3,000 last Monday. Telephone advices from a forest ranger indicate that Diamond eluded the trap set for him along Whiskey creek and is making directly for the Gold Beach country, where it is believed he is planning to escape by boat.

Invading another mining camp yesterday, Diamond showed his first defiant attitude by telling the miners he "had the drop" on them. They had tried to detain him, but saw his cocked rifle and let him depart in peace at his veiled threat.

Quine was unable to secure any pac horses at West Fork yesterday, and returned here last night, expecting to proceed again as soon as possible today.

The trails through the mountains west of here are rugged and pursuit is difficult. It is estimated that Diamond is making about twenty-five miles a day.

### OPENING ROADS FOR TRAVEL TO CRATER LAKE PARK

Folders have been issued by the company descriptive of Crater Lake and how to get there. It contains the following regarding the Medford route:

The Pacific & Eastern Railroad Co. (the Crater Lake Route), have joined with the Crater Lake company in making a special round trip rate between Medford and Crater Lake of \$15.00. The service will be tri-weekly at the start, but will be increased to a daily service as soon as the travel warrants it. The service will be from Medford to Crater Lake on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, returning Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, on the following schedule.

The S. P. Co. have agreed to sell special excursion tickets from all points in Oregon to Crater Lake and return via Medford at one and one-third the regular fare to Medford, in connection with the above service.

This will give a round trip rate to Crater Lake from Portland of \$28.20 and equally low rates in proportion from all other points north of Medford.
