J. THORBUN ROSS
GIVEN PAROLE

SALEM, Ore., July 1.—J. Thorburn Ross, the former Portland banker, who was sentenced to five years in the penitentiary for the wrongful diversion of common school funds, was Monday given a parole from the bench of Judge Percy R. Kelly of the Marion county circuit court.

Following the failure of the Title Guarantee & Trust company of Portland, of which Ross was president, he was convicted in April, 1908, of appropriating to his own use certain sums of the common school funds which were on deposit in his bank.

The case then went to the United States supreme court, where the conviction was again affirmed. In the meantime the defunct bank was taken over by other interests and all its obligations were paid, including the money due the school fund.

The parole is conditioned on good behavior and that Ross keep the court advised as to his whereabouts and activities.
