FACTIONAL SPLITS
TEARING SOCIALIST
PARTY OF FRANCE

PARIS, July 31.—Already split into "red" and "yellow," or revolutionary and conservative groups, the French general confederation of labor has been further subdivided over the measures the syndicalists propose to take, as a demonstration against the government and the new three-year service army law and the decree ordering the liberable portion of the army to remain an extra year under the colors.

\$8000 EIGHT DAYS
ALASKA PLACER

CORDOVA, Alaska, July 31.—Coming out for more provisions, John Moon and Gus Larson, are at McCarty today, direct from the new placer strike in the Shushanna district. They report that Jennings, the owner of Discovery, has taken out \$8000 in eight days with two men shoveling and that men on the claim above Discovery were taking out \$25 a day panning with ordinary tin plates.

STATE RIGHTS TO
WATER POWER
PLANTS IN COURT

DENVER, Colo., July 31.—The right of the government to control power sites and water rights and to force individuals and corporations to buy its will in the matter of taking out permits and paying fees for the use of government lands, will be fought out in a case which began in the United States district court here today. The government is trying to force the Central Colorado Power company to take out permits from the forestry service before it uses the forest lands. It is alleged that Colorado is rapidly drifting into "the arms of the power octopus" and that the state, through its law officers, is unwittingly aiding and abetting the great eastern power concerns by intervening in the case and asking to be heard against the government.

DANIELS PRAISED
BY GRAND LODGE

T. E. Daniels has returned from Rochester, N. Y., where he represented the Medford lodge at the grand lodge. He states that there is a vast degree of difference between a convention held east and one in the west or south. Easterners are cold-blooded and do not enthuse, he says, while the south and west put themselves out to make their guests visit an enjoyable one.

JAPS CANNOT BEAT
LAW BY COMPANIES

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., July 31.—Flat declaration that incorporation by Japanese will not enable them to defeat the provisions of California's alien land bill was voiced here today by Attorney General Webb, author of the bill. "No object of the law is defeated by these incorporations," said the attorney general today. "The law does not and was not intended to force Japanese now owning land to part with it at once or within any fixed period. They were to be permitted to hold it during their lifetimes. By forming corporations, Japanese landowners who are invalids or advanced in years merely extend their period of ownership a few years. But after August 19 land cannot be purchased by Japanese, either as individuals or corporations, and the object of the law, to prevent an increase in the amount of land held by ineligible aliens.

PLAN ICE SKATING
RINK FOR PORTLAND

SALEM, Ore., July 31.—Portland citizens will soon be treated to the novelty of ice skating if the plans outlined in articles of incorporation filed by the Portland Ice Hippodrome company with the secretary of state here today are carried out. The company, which is capitalized at \$200,000, plans the construction of a large lake, under cover, and artificially frozen. The incorporators are Edward H. Savage, Fred A. Wilson and Marion F. Dolph of Portland.

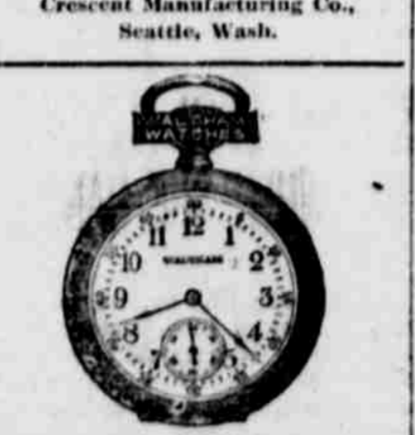
