### FACTIONAL SPLITS TEARING SOCIALIST PARTY OF FRANCE

PARIS. July 31 .- Already split into "red" and yellow," or revolutionary and conservative groups, the French general confederation of labor has been further subdivided over the measures the syndicalists propose to take, as a demonstration against the government and the new three-year service army law and the decree ordering the liberable portion of the army to remain an extra year under the colors.

One faction advocates a general strike, the other, and larger, group "inviting labor unions to redouble their activities, encouraging the ing classes." This last is the official attitude of the confederation of labor, and, as the "reds" are dominant, this rather vague program is taken by the French government as a sign that the numerous arrests will scarcely need the dissolution order from the government, but will fall of its own accord.

Whatever happens, there is a strong movement on foot throughout Frauce among labor leaders to build up a new confederation upon the rnins of the old, patterning it as far as possible after the general confederation of labor in the United States.

## WATER POWER PLANTS IN COURT

DENVER, Colo., July 71 .- The right of the government to control power sites and water rights and to force individuals and equiporations to buy its will in the matter of taking out permits and paying fees for the use of government lands, will be fought out in a case which began in the United States district court here today. The government is trying to force the Central Colorado Power

company to take out permits from the forestry service before it uses the forest lands. It is alleged that Colorado is rapidly drifting into "the arms of the power octopus" and that the state, through its law officers, is unwittingly aiding and abetting the great eastern power concerns by intervening in the case and asking to be heard against the government. The entire issue of the government

and state's rights will be involved before the ease is finished and if the government is successful it is understood that similar court proceedings will be immediately instituted in a half dozen other western states. The government contends that it is merely acting as a protector of the state and the individuals and that it is trying to prevent a monopoly of natural resources from which the state of colorado should receive a huge annual income. ## STARR STIRS UP HORNET'S NEST BY DECRYING WOMEN

CHICAGO, July 31. Declaration that "woman is inferior to man and always has been," has stirred up a hornets' nest of criticism here today about the head of Professor Starr of the University of Chicago. Addressing the anthropology class of that institution, Starr said:

"Woman is the inferior of man, She always has been and in the nature of things always will be. The present seeming equality is due to the fact that man is only marking time. When he resumes the race he will take the leadership again."

Chicago suffragettes were amazed when Starr's remarks were published and then from all quarters came heated denials. Dr. Cornella D. Hey, a prominent leader of the suffrage movement here, said:

"The woman is the mother of the babe, and the babe is a greater crestive evidence than man has ever demonstrated. I believe Professor Starr has drawn the wrong conclus-Woman's activities have been discouraged for centuries. They are still discouraged in uncivilized coun-Woman is evolving slowly. but when she reaches her full stature she will be ready to take her place beside man for larger action.


