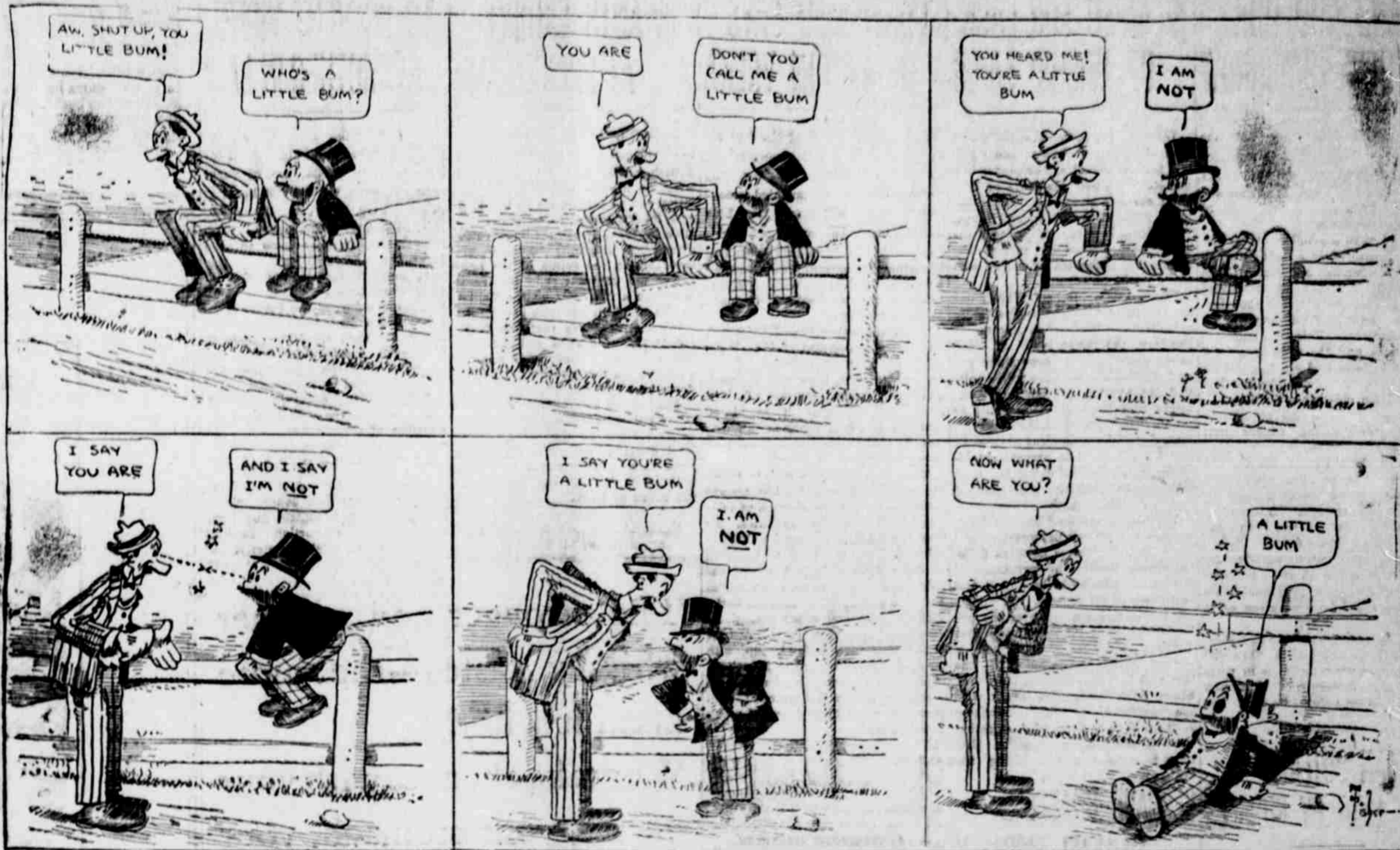
Presbyterian Church
