Ordinance No. 772. An ordinance providing for the licensing and regulation of automobiles operated for hire in the city of Medford, fixing the terms and conditions of such license, providing for penalties for violation, and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

Section 1. Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person to own, maintain or operate an automobile used for carrying passengers for hire in the city of Medford, Oregon, without first obtaining from the city recorder a license for such automobile in the manner provided in this ordinance.

Section 2. Before using or permitting the use of any automobile for the carrying of passengers for hire within the city of Medford, the owner thereof shall procure from the city recorder a license for such automobile, the fee for which shall be \$10.00.

Section 3. No person operating any automobile for hire in Medford shall charge or exact from any passenger or passengers as compensation any sum in excess of the following schedule of rates: For one or two passengers, first half mile .50; Each additional quarter mile thereafter .12 1/2.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council of the city of Medford, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1913, by the following vote: Yeas, Mitchell, aye; Stewart, aye; Campbell, aye; Miller, aye; and Summerville, absent.

NOTICE FOR WOOD BIDS. The city council of Medford, Oregon, will receive sealed bids at its regular meeting, August 19th, 1913, for the purchase of about seventy-five (75) or more, cords of first class Body Fir Wood, in four foot lengths, delivered in Medford.

For conveying passengers to circus or like assemblages at the Fair Grounds or at any other place within one and one-half miles of the Southern Pacific depot, for each passenger, each way, not to exceed 25c, providing there are three or more passengers for the trip.
