ORDINANCE NO. 773.
 An ordinance amending ordinance No. 133 of the city of Medford, by adding thereto section 29; the same being an ordinance to provide for the prevention of fires and the protection of persons and property endangered thereby; to regulate the construction, alteration and repair of buildings and to establish fire limits in the city of Medford, Oregon.
 The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:
 That ordinance No. 133 of the city of Medford, be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto section 29, the same to read as follows:
 Section 29. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or corporation, to erect, construction, or build, any permanent dwelling house or other buildings within the corporate limits of the said city of Medford, without first having made written application to the city recorder for permission to construct such dwelling house or other building, and without having first received from the city recorder written permission to construct or erect such building or dwelling house. Such application must be signed by the person, firm or officer or agent, if a corporation, of such corporation, desiring to erect or construct such building or dwelling house, and shall show the name of the street and the lot or description of the property upon which the same is to be erected. Upon such application the city recorder shall issue the applicant, free of charge, a written permit to construct or erect such building.
 The foregoing ordinance was passed by the city council of the city of Medford on the 5th day of August, 1913, by the following vote:
