ORDINANCE NO. 774

An ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 659 of the city of Medford, entitled:

An ordinance regulating the use and sale of water in the city of Medford, and prescribing rates for the use thereof and repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

That said ordinance No. 659 of the city of Medford, entitled, an ordinance regulating the use and sale of water in the city of Medford, and prescribing rates for the use thereof and repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith, shall be and is hereby amended by adding section 22 thereto, which shall read as follows:

Section 22. Whenever heretofore or hereafter any person having control with the said city's water mains, who shall maintain on his premises a private system for fire protection, shall not use the same nor permit water to be taken therefrom for any other purpose save the emergency of fire, in which case no rate or charges shall be made for said water so used. And any person found violating this section shall be fined, upon conviction, before the mayor's court in a sum not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00.

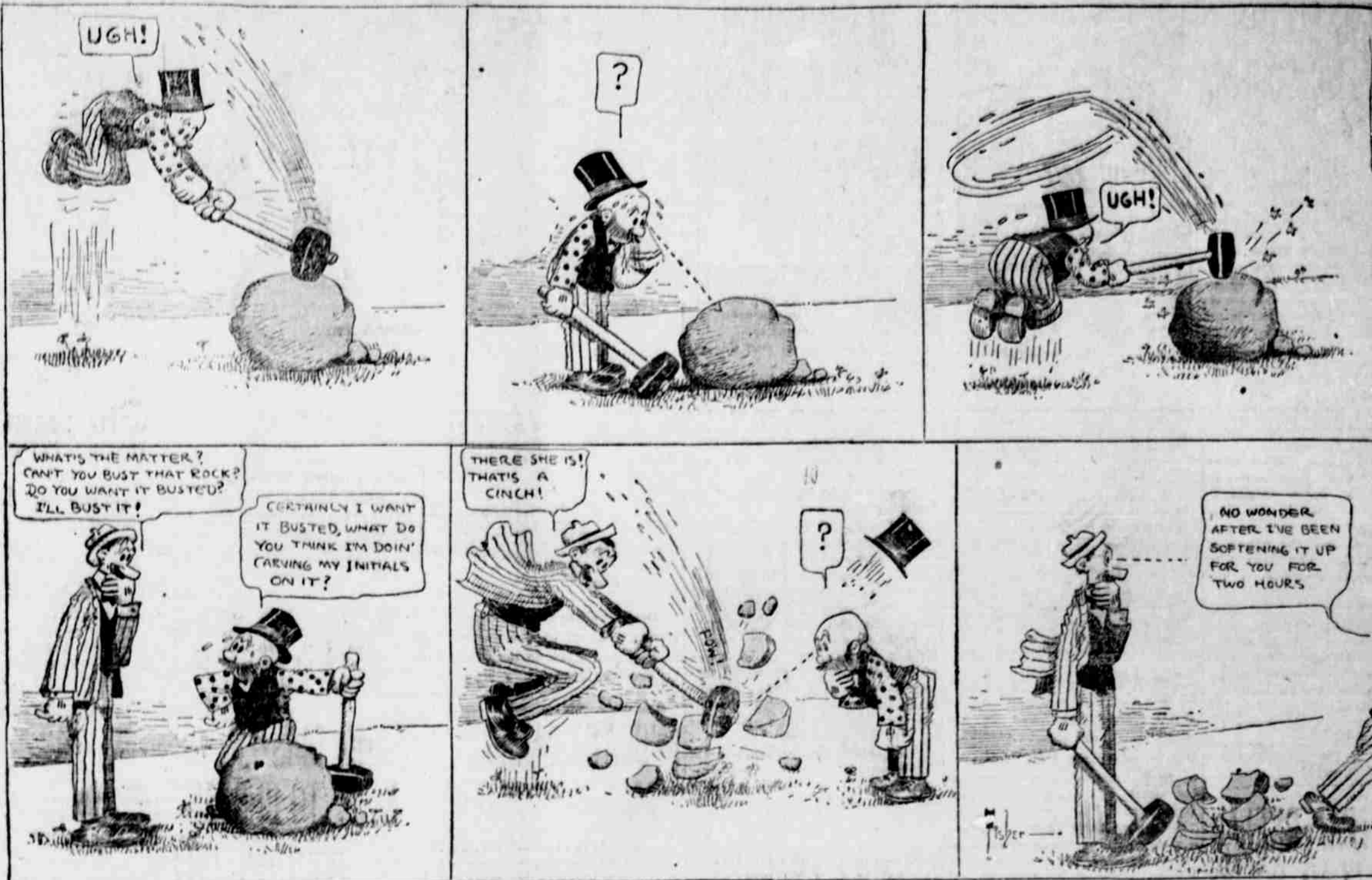
