ANCIENT GREEK SCULPTURE FOUND IN BALTIMORE

"Aphrodite," carved 3000 years ago in Greece, was dug from a Baltimore cellar the other day, where it had reposed for half a dozen years, and might have been lost for all time. The statue, the head of a girl, perhaps five years of age, was in the National Museum of Athens for many years. In 1900 it was stolen. The Greek government spent large sums in tracing it, and finally the information came that a Greek candy merchant of Baltimore had it. He confessed when detectives put him through the third degree, and took them to the cellar where they unearthed it. He said that an unknown Greek who had worked for him had given it as security for a debt, and he had buried it for fear some one would steal it. The merchant is under arrest, but the thief who sold it to him cannot be found. The statue will be shipped back to Athens. Its discovery was due largely to the efforts of A. C. Voures, Greek charge d'affaires in Washington.

SHIP VEGETABLES TO CALIFORNIA

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—By a vote of 39 to 3 the senate this afternoon defeated Senator Bristow's amendment to the sugar clause in the tariff bill, reducing the duty on sugar from 1.92 to 1.52 cents a pound, with a subsequent graduated reduction to one cent in 1919.
