**TWENTY MILLIONS  
 GIVEN TO CITY FOR  
 CARE OF ANIMALS**

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Aug. 9.—For the relief and care of dumb animals \$20,500,000; gift to the city of Evansville, Ind., \$20,000,000.  
 These two gifts, made by Adolph Melzer, wealthy Indian, will be available in the year 2123 A. D. They are the strangest gifts ever made to an Indiana city. The \$20,500,000 for the care and relief of dumb animals will be the principle of a deeded compound interest on a sum of \$5000 which has been deposited in a local bank by Melzer, and which will have grown to that amount in 210 years from today. The \$20,000,000 which Evansville will get, will be the principle and accrued compound interest on \$1,000,000 deposited by Melzer and available in 250 years.  
 Melzer's scheme in both cases is that the funds will be allowed to stay in one bank for eighteen years or until the original deposit doubles itself. The total then will be divided into two equal units and redposited in different banks until they in turn are doubled, and so on. By the time the "dumb animal" fund is taken out finally it will be deposited in 2,048 banks.  
 Realizing possible future changes in monetary conditions may occur, Melzer's contract makes it possible for the bank, state or city to withdraw from the agreement on sixty days notice, in which case the money is to be redposited in any banking institution with \$100,000 or more capital at the best rate of interest obtainable.

**HAMBURG LINE BOOSTS

HAMBURG, Aug. 20.—Disregarding the German government's refusal to participate in the Panama Pacific exposition, Manager Ballin of the Hamburg-American steamship line declared here today that he would do his utmost to promote German representation at San Francisco in 1915. Ballin thinks the government made a grave mistake in refusing to participate in the exposition.

**Crater Lake Travel**

The Hall taxi company sent three cars to Crater lake this morning, consisting of seventeen people, and will send another car of five people tomorrow morning. Medford is certainly getting its share of the tourist trade this season, and too much credit cannot be given to the Hall Taxi company for their efficient service and the amount of advertising they have done to bring the people here. The next four weeks will be Crater lake's busiest season. As many people who have already visited the lake this season have returned home and induced their friends to make the trip to see one of the world's greatest natural wonders. Next year's travel will be greater than ever, and Medford should prepare to accommodate the tourist trade during the 1915 fair at San Francisco.

**\$100,000 Fire at San Jose.**

SAN JOSE, Cal., Aug. 20.—Property damage of \$100,000 is caused here today by a fire which razed a block of business buildings, destroyed the Chase Lumber company yards, the Alameda grocery, the West San Jose postoffice and several dwellings. Two firemen were overcome by smoke but will recover.

**X-RAYS CURE FOR  
 TUBERCULOSIS SAYS  
 DENVER DOCTOR**

DENVER, Colo., Aug. 20.—"It will be possible in ten years to eliminate tuberculosis of the lungs."  
 This statement, made by Dr. Jefferson D. Gibson, pulmonary tuberculosis specialist of Denver, and originator of a plan by which the dread disease which kills more persons than any other malady, can be stayed, has resulted in appeals from thousands all over the country for more details of his proposed treatment. Dr. Gibson's statement was made before the convention of Homeopathic physicians held here recently. Many physicians have commended and approved Dr. Gibson's treatment, but there have been others to criticize it adversely.  
 Dr. Gibson proposes to eliminate tuberculosis of the lungs by an X-ray treatment, augmented by infection of a serum, sunlight and fresh air. His somewhat technical explanation of the treatment before the physicians convention has not been fully understood by laymen and to answer his critics he today gave a practical explanation through the United Press.  
 "The first part of infection in a vast majority of cases of lung tuberculosis," said Dr. Gibson, "originates in the bronchial glands and radiates from there to the top of the lungs. It then spreads fan-like over the remainder of the lung tissues."  
 "Splendid results have been obtained by treating the glands of the neck, abdomen and other parts with the X-ray. The X-ray will produce equally good results if applied to the bronchial glands. It thus cuts short, or prevents pulmonary tuberculosis entirely."  
 "Aided by tuberculin or Von Reuck's new vaccine, the X-ray should give perfect results in these cases. By this means, I claim that it is possible in ten years to wipe out lung tuberculosis. I predict that ten years from now it will be a disgrace for a physician to allow a case to develop among his clients."  
 Sunlight and fresh air, according to Dr. Gibson, are important, but they alone will never effect a complete cure. They will give relief and in some cases strengthen the lungs and the system sufficient to fight off the ravages of the disease for years, but they do not cure and prevent parents afflicted from passing the disease on to future generations.

The father and mother, it is said, will not attend the wedding.

Smith, of Oakland, are slightly injured as the result of an automobile accident which occurred last night near San Mateo. Alexander was killed almost instantly.

 The wives of Alexander and Andrews are prostrated over the affair. Neither could tell anything of Mrs. Smith or Mrs. Spaulding.

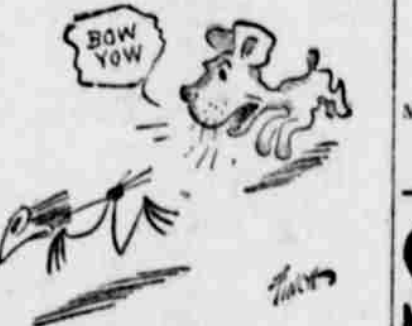

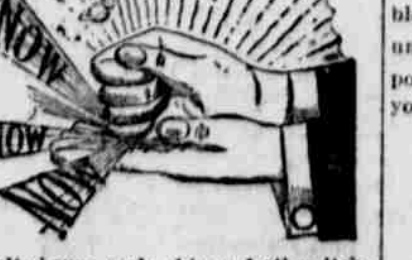
