The liberal press calls it "the drunken budget." The annual sale of alcohol is stated to have grown from 170,000,000 gallons to 240,000,000 gallons, and it is estimated that in the current year the total income from this source will be \$400,000,-000, or more than one-fourth the entire revenue of the empire.

When the government monopoly of the sale of spirits was established in 1895 it was confined at first to four governmental departments, but within a decade it has been gradually extended to the whole of Russia, with the exception of a half-dozen of the smaller outlying provinces. 
