

FRUIT DISTRIBUTORS MARKET POTATOES

At Pocatello, Idaho, August 30, will be held a meeting for the formal organization of an Idaho potato sub-central of the North Pacific Fruit Distributors, and the making of grade and pack rules for the handling of potatoes. With an assurance of 2000 cars of potatoes from South Idaho, North Pacific Fruit Distributors for the season of 1913, will handle potatoes in carload lots from any district in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana, where the established grade and pack rules are strictly complied with, and where the potatoes are definitely signed under contract to a local non-organized or to be organized in affiliation with one of the sub-centrals of the distributors.

J. C. McPherson, the present state horticultural commissioner of Idaho, has been employed as general superintendent of all field operations, and he will be assisted by inspectors working under his direction and under the same rigid rules that now govern the inspection and handling of fruit. This department will give its time exclusively to the business of potatoes, and outside of the superintendent, inspectors and experienced and capable potato salesmen are now employing, will require no additional overhead expense in the handling of potatoes.
