Beginning at the corner between fractional sections thirteen (13) and fourteen (14) in township forty-eight (48) north of range seven (7) west of the Mount Diablo Meridian, California, connecting with the survey of the State Highway of California; thence northerly along the route as now staked out to present county road; thence following as near as practical the main county road into and through the city of Asland, a municipal corporation of Jackson county, Oregon; thence following the main traveled county road through the towns of Talent, Phoenix, Medford and Central Point, in a north-westerly direction; thence following, as near as practical, the county road in a north-westerly direction to a point at or near the stream known as Rogue River; thence following the main traveled county road along said stream in a westerly direction, and terminating at the point where the main traveled county road on the south side of Rogue River crosses the county line between the counties of Jackson and Josephine, Oregon, and at or near said stream known as the Rogue river. The terminus of said road, as herein directed, is definite and permanent. The line above described between the termini thereof shall be as herein ordered, and shall follow the most practical route for a permanent road, and said road shall be a permanent road and highway through said county.
