COUNTY SHOULD MAKE GOOD ON ROAD PROMISES

In making a bid for the 1914 convention of the delegates to the Pacific Coast Good Roads convention, Geo. E. Boas, delegate from the Rogue River and Jackson county extended the following invitation: "The City of Medford, located in the famous Rogue River valley, Oregon, twenty miles north of the California line, on the line of the Southern Pacific railway, desires the honor of entertaining this convention in 1914."

"Medford is a city of 12,000 population, has three splendid hotels and one of the largest auditoriums in the state. It is located midway between the northern and southern limits of the jurisdiction of this association, and is easily accessible to all the delegates."

"Medford is in Jackson county, which was the first county in Oregon to call an election for a Good Roads bond issue of \$500,000."

HARVEST FESTIVAL A GREAT SUCCESS

An enthusiastic good roads rally was held at Rogue River Friday afternoon in connection with the Harvest Festival. Addresses in favor of road bonds were made by Judge W. M. Colvig, Attorney Porter J. Neff and Commissioner W. C. Leever. Sentiment seemed unanimous for the bonds.

The festival was a great success. Grains and vegetables and fruit of every kind was exhibited, showing what farms in that fertile section can produce. Rabbits that reached almost the perfect mark were displayed, and afterwards paraded through the streets in baby cart-decorated like floats in the July 4 parade.

The school exhibits of vegetables and domestic science and manual training attracted much attention. The prize winners as well as the prize exhibits of fruits and grain will be taken to the Jackson County fair in yet bigger prizes.

A chicken dinner served by the ladies at the Ridd farm added much to enjoyment of the occasion.

practical the main county road into and through the city of Ashland, a municipal corporation of Jackson county, Oregon; thence following the main traveled county road through the towns of Talent, Phoenix, Medford and Central Point, in a north-westerly direction; thence following, as near as practical, the county road in a northwesterly direction to a point at or near the stream known as Rogue River; thence following the main traveled county road along said stream in a westerly direction, and terminating at the point where the main traveled county road on the south side of Rogue River crosses the county line between the counties of Jackson and Josephine, Oregon, and at or near said stream known as the Rogue River. The terminal of said road, as herein directed, is definite and permanent. The line above described between the terminal thereof shall be as herein ordered, and shall follow the most practical route for a permanent road, and said road shall be a permanent road and highway through said county.
