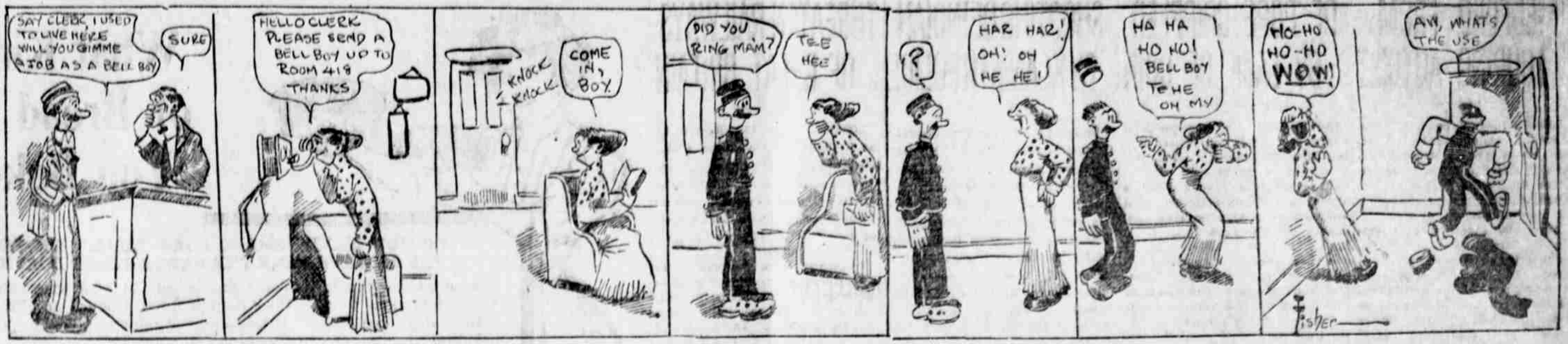

### FIGHTING FIRE IN RAILROAD TUNNEL

**RAN LUE OBISPO, Cal., Sept. 19.**—Crumbling earth at the south portal of the Santa Margarita tunnel on the Southern Pacific coast line blocked today the efforts of two hundred men who are fighting a fire that is consuming the tunnel's staving. The fire, which spread from burning mountain brush, is reported to have eaten its way a quarter of a mile into the bore.

Fires in the mountains in the Santa Margarita district are being held in check and no damage to ranch property is anticipated.

General Manager W. R. Scott, of the Southern Pacific, overseeing by boat while directing the fire-fighters at the tunnel last night, had recovered today. He started for San Luis Obispo with Vice President E. E. Calvin.

### BOOMERANG DUTY ON WHEAT AND FLOUR

**WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.**—Settlement of the differences between the senate and house over the proposed duties on wheat and flour was reached by the democratic members of the tariff conference committee today. The nature of the agreement was not made public but it is understood that the house members finally accepted the senate amendment almost unchanged.

Under this provision wheat and flour would go on the free list. A duty of ten cents a bushel is assessed against wheat from any country levying a duty on American wheat and forty-five cents a barrel against flour imported under like conditions.

It is expected the conference will approve the countervailing duty of ten per cent on spuds which both houses put on the free list. The agreement was reached on the meat inspection provision so that imported meats will be as rigidly inspected as American.

### BEAUTIFUL PRINCESS DIES BY OWN HAND

**HEIDELBERG, Germany, Sept. 19.**—Princess Sophia of Saxe-Wormer Eisenach, a beautiful young woman of a sunny disposition and much courted by officers with whom she often rode to the hounds at Baden court, committed suicide early Thursday.

The body with a bullet wound in her temple was found in her room in the palace of her father, Prince Wilhelm. The death of the princess was due to a love affair. She was engaged to marry Hans von Bleicheröder, eldest son of the senior member of one of the most powerful German banking houses.

When the engagement was announced several months ago it was learned the reigning grand duke prohibited the marriage unless the princess renounced all her titles and dignities. This she refused.
