

# JACKSON COUNTY TAKES ADVANTAGE STATE UNIVERSITY

The date for the new bonding election, at which the issue of \$200,000 bonds for the construction of the Wilderville road will be validated, will be set by the council for October 10. A New York firm of attorneys has agreed to direct the action of the council in preparing the papers for the new election, the specified fee to be \$500, and the amendment to the city charter has already been drafted.

PORTLAND, Or., Sept. 24.—To stimulate the lumber industry in the Willamette valley, Southern Pacific officials are today considering a reduction in rates from points to points in California north of San Francisco bay. If the reduction is made it is understood millowners of Portland will appeal to the interstate commerce commission on the grounds that they will be discriminated against.
