

WOMEN WAGE WAR ON IMMODEST DRESS

CHICAGO, Ills., Sept. 26.—Every W. C. T. U. local and women's organization in the United States will be asked to fight the "indecent tendencies of modern dress styles" by setting young girls an example in dressing. The campaign to drive the slit skirt, immodest waist, diaphanous skirt and indecently tight, form-displaying dress back to the demi-monde from whence it came, was outlined today at the closing session of the annual convention of the Cook County Women's Christian Temperance Union. The request that women's organizations all over the United States aid in the fight will be made probably by letter. Appeals also will be made to the officials of style shows and the heads of establishments which manufacture dresses in every city in the country. Preceding the adoption of the plan of campaign prominent speakers scathingly denounced women's apparel which displays the figure. Decoletage evening gowns also came in for severe criticism today.

WASHINGTON CROSSING DELAWARE MEMORIAL

TRENTON, N. J., Sept. 26.—Thousands of members of the Patriotic Order of the Sons of America representing all sections of the country today took part in dedicating the monument commemorative of Washington's famous crossing of the Delaware. The dedication was the closing feature of the convention of the order which has been in session here since Tuesday. The convention marked the twenty-fifth anniversary of the organization of the New Jersey state camp, the twenty-sixth anniversary of the founding of the order, and the twenty-second anniversary of the founding of the Commandery General or uniformed rank. The monument stands on the spot, eight miles from here, where Washington and his colonials landed just before the battle of Trenton in 1776. The land about the monument has been set aside as a park.
