On the night of September 5 he cut the throats of his wife and four children wille sleeping, becked up the house, left a note on the door that the family had gone owny, went to the village of Muhihausen, set fire to several houses and with two automatic revolvers shot and killed ten and wounded nearly a score of persons as the villagers rushed out of their houses.

Wagner is a school teacher. He is puzzle to physicians and psychologists alike. Medical authorities diclare that he is sane, and he himse)! logies velicimently that he was no balanced when he committed the murders; on the contrary, he declared that he had planned and contendated them for months. "

Wagner while school teacher in Mulbarrien betrayed a young girl and was compelled to marry her.
