ELLIS CONFESSES TO KILLING WIFE

CHICAGO, Oct. 17.-William Ellis, member of a wealthy Cincinnati famly, confessed this afternoon at a coroner's inquest here that he killed his wife in the Hotel Sherman yesterday by slashing her throat, and then attempted to end his own life,

"Yes!" he screamed. "I killed her! I almost cut her head from her body. My God! It was awful I am sorry I didn't die, too."
