Plans and specifications are under consideration and it is barely possible that construction may begin in the spring, if not earlier. Demand for immediate action comes from every city where public buildings have been authorized but all meet the same fate of construction in order.

Mail Tribune: I am just in receipt of your night letter in re Medford post office, and am enclosing you, as per your request, a copy of the bill introduced by me in Congress.

I am writing you in reference to the Medford post office, so that it is unnecessary to repeat. Further than to say that neither Mr. Hatch nor anybody else can get this building taken up out of its regular order. The plans have not yet been approved, but I have every reason to believe that they will be shortly, and that work will begin in the spring. So far as beginning it this fall is concerned, it is out of the question entirely, although this office occupies as favorable a position as any on the calendar. No amount of political influence nor any other consideration will induce the department to take up a building out of its regular order, because the same demand is made from every city in the union where a public building has been appropriated for.
