WANT TAXES RAISED FOR SCHOOL FUND

At a meeting of the school officers of Jackson county at the Medford high school Saturday it was unanimously voted to support the movement in the state for a higher tax for schools so that a more uniform system of taxation could be secured and a committee was named to prepare data on school finances and submit the same to the county court with a view to securing an enlarged unit of taxation so that the tax burden may be more equally divided. An increase of one mill is to be asked in the school levy. The committee is as follows: Welborn Heeson, Talent; Mrs. E. E. Gore, Medford; James A. Gore, Griffin Creek.

In the morning, Welborn Heeson talked on school finances and taxation and in the afternoon, Mrs. J. C. Pendleton of Table Rock gave an interesting paper on the school as a social center. Following Mrs. Pendleton, E. F. Carleton, asst. state school supt. of Salem addressed the meeting on school fairs and a general discussion followed concerning manual and domestic science.

The resolutions both adopted unanimously were as follows:

Whereas, there are many school districts that are unable to properly maintain school on the funds received from the county and state; and, whereas, the assessed valuation of many districts is not large enough to furnish funds from a reasonable special tax to cover the deficiency; therefore, be it resolved, that this meeting endorse the movement of the state department of education for the betterment of schools throughout the state, and suggest that, said board continue their efforts to have a law passed that will provide for a state tax of as many mills as shall be necessary to provide a fund for the proper maintenance of every public school in this state.

Whereas the schools of the county need the advice and moral support of men and women of experience and high ideals, and whereas, as our grand old man, Hon. C. C. Beekman has accepted a position on the school board, district No. 1, Jacksonville, a district he helped to organize, therefore, be it resolved that this assembly of school officials extend to him our appreciation of his sacrifice and effort in the cause of public education.

VICE SCANDAL SHOCKS GERMANY

BERLIN, Oct. 20.—Sensational disclosures rivaling and similar to the details of the notorious "Eulen-berg round-table scandals" were predicted today when Walter Steintal, publisher of a local weekly went on trial here charged with criminal libel. Steintal, in his paper, charged that Count von Hulsen-Haesler, director general of the Kaiser's Royal Opera, is a moral pervert of the Oscar Wilde type. Count von Hulsen-Haesler is an intimate friend of Kaiser Wilhelm.

Steintal, besides accusing the count of being a moral pervert, declared also that one of the best known actors in Germany, who is attached to the Royal Court Theater, of which Hulsen-Haesler is one of the directors, belongs to the Wilde category and belongs to a "second round table" with the count who today appeared against him as plaintiff. Steintal today naively declared that "such persons need not feel insulted or libelled as the time is past when this moral perversion is taken as a symptom of degeneracy or mental deficiency." Because of Steintal's repeated and calm accusations, the air is full of rumors that his trial will bring about a public sensation of moral degeneracy in high circles second only to the Eulen-berg scandal or ostled. That case began with a charge of libel against Editor Harden who was only looking for an opportunity to make public his evidence.
