MEXICAN MEDDLING NOT TO BE TOLERATED

WASHINGTON, Oct. 24.—The United States government is preparing to notify the nations of the world generally that any interference in Mexican affairs will be regarded as unfriendly to this government.

President Wilson and Secretary Bryan and Consul General Bass Moore of the state department, have exchanged ideas on what the proclamation to the world should express. It will be communicated to the foreign governments in line with the policy established earlier of keeping other nations informed of every step taken in handling the Mexican situation.

The proclamation will also serve, it is understood, as an explicit definition of the policy of the United States, reiterating the principle that recognition can only be given to governments on this hemisphere founded on law and order. It is practically decided to hold the proclamation in abeyance until after the elections in Mexico next Sunday.

FACTORY GIRLS LEAP ABLAZE FROM WINDOWS

NEW YORK, Oct. 24.—A gas oven on the top floor of a six story factory building on Canal street exploded today killing four, three of them women. More than a score were injured and burned in the fire that followed. A searchlight played on the ruins tonight while the firemen sought for more bodies. About 200 were employed in the building. The escape of many of the trapped workers was with clothing ablaze as they climbed out through the flame swept windows to the fire escapes and dropped to the sidewalks. Spectators beat out the flames with clothing.

FIRST AERIAL SQUADRON FLIES AT SAN JOSE, CAL.

SAN DIEGO, Oct. 24.—The first aerial squadron ever seen here and perhaps the first witnessed in America was the spectacle beheld at North Island today, when six qualified military aviators rose from the aerodrome within a few minutes of each other and flew for a short time at an altitude of a thousand feet. The roar of the six motors could be heard for miles. The aircraft descended without attempting any fleet maneuvers.

WOMAN CRAZED JEALOUSY TRIES TO KILL SELF

OAKLAND, Cal., Oct. 25.—Crazed with jealousy over the alleged attentions paid to another woman by her husband, and still grieving over the death of her mother two years ago, Mrs. Millie Drown fired two shots at her heart yesterday morning in an unsuccessful attempt to kill herself, and then a few minutes later shot her husband, Archer C. Drown, twice through the head, killing him instantly.

Twelve hours later Mrs. Drown attempted to kill Mrs. Marie Miller, housekeeper for Dr. Henry M. Fine, in the kitchen of the Fine home, placing her revolver against Mrs. Miller's back as she stooped to look at an oven, but forgetting to release the trigger lock of the weapon. Then she fled.

At 11:30 o'clock last night she informed W. H. Drown, brother of her husband, and a lawyer of San Francisco, of the tragedy. The woman led Drown to the home of the couple and showed the dead body of her husband. A physician was summoned and the police notified. Mrs. Drown was placed under arrest early today. She is now in a cell in the Oakland city prison, raving incoherently.

MEXICAN REBELS NOW PROP OF PRESIDENT WILSON

NOGALES, Oct. 24.—A report from Hermosilla today indicated that the Washington government is preparing to negotiate with General Venustiano Carranza, the leader of the constitutionalists in the north through a special envoy to be appointed by President Wilson.

It was said Carranza already had wired instructions for preparations of quarters to be occupied by the special representative. This tends to confirm the reports that the United States is preparing to recognize the revolutionists as a factor in the attempt to bring about a reign of peace. The envoy, it is reported, will undertake duties similar to those imposed on John Lind, the president's special representative now at Vera Cruz.
