WILSON'S SPEECH PLEASES MEXICANS

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 25.—Mexicans generally were much pleased with President Wilson's speech at Mobile yesterday in which he said the United States seeks no more foreign territory and virtually reiterated the Monroe doctrine for the benefit of other powers. The speech was published at considerable length in the local newspapers and attracted a great deal of attention.

Rather curiously, foreigners in the city, as well as Mexicans, were satisfied. They got the impression somehow, that it implied an intention to intervene, withdrawing when order is restored, and though foreigners were not enthusiastic over the latter part of the program, American intervention is just what they have wanted for months.

President Huerta issued a statement today, saying it probably will be a month before the official election returns will be in.

A rumor was current that Huerta means to keep his word.

GRANTS PASS HUNTER IS SHOT FOR DEER

GRANTS PASS, Oct. 28.—Herman Schmidt, son of Claus Schmidt, was shot in the right leg by Fritz Gebers while hunting deer with a party of friends Sunday, the bullet from a .30 caliber high power rifle shattering the femoral bone and making a most severe wound that will render the limb useless for a long time, though the surgeons believe that it can be saved and made a serviceable member again.

Schmidt, in company with Fritz Gebers, his cousin; Lloyd Launer, Harvey Paulson and Lester Sparlin, went out to Waters creek, near Winder, Saturday evening to hunt deer on Sunday. Schmidt and Gebers were hunting along the creek near its head, where the canyon is abrupt and steep, one on each side of the creek. Gebers says that he saw a deer and shot once at it, the aim being too high to hit the deer, but that the bullet evidently struck a rock at a tree and was deflected from its course, striking Schmidt, who was seated on a rock about 200 yards distant, in the leg.

STOCK RETURNED FREE FROM LIVESTOCK SHOW

The Trans-Continental Freight Bureau has issued Tariff No. 54-A, which provides for free return of all stock exhibits made at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition to be held at Union Stock Yards, North Portland, Oregon, December 8-13, 1913. This is a very signal recommendation of the importance of this show, as never before in the history of shows on the west coast has a rate been made which would permit of the movement of livestock exhibits from the middle west under like favorable ruling.

Several Eastern and Canadian breeders have declared their intention of coming to the International Exposition, as they realize that some of the keenest competition in the United States is to be found right here on the Pacific slope.

The various development leagues and commercial clubs of Oregon, Washington and Idaho are taking steps looking towards special trains from all the livestock centers in the northwest. Railroads have made a rate of one and one-third on the certificate plan. This is an opportunity for people to see the Live Stock Show, and at the same pay a visit of ten days to the city of Portland.
