"The law does not require that the criminal be notified of such opera tion. This is a very serious defect. There is also nothing in the law to make the proceedings of the board public. In the hands of a corrupt board of health, or with corrupt superintendents of state institutions it would be possible to work a great hardship on many people.

"Only five per cent of our criminals are ever brought to trial. When ninety-five per cent are at large, it does not seem as though the law could accomplish much good, even if the state board would carry it out. For myself, and I have been a member of the board for ten years, I would not order such an operation, and I do not believe that any of my present colleagues would."
