The great broncho busting or bucking contest is the magnet that draws the great rough-riders of America, and the winner of which gains many points toward the allaround cowboy championship of the world and the gold belt that goes with it. A. E. McCormack, of Goldsmith, Wyoming, gained the championship for 1913-14, and his winning ride is faithfully shown in the 1913-14 Round-up pictures.

The 1913 Round-up was held September 11-12-13, and practically every western state was represented. as there were over 200 of the most expert cowboys and cowgirls entered in the different events. The west is known for its activity, but action reaches its very zenith in the Roundup.
