ORDER BIG HARVESTER TRUST TO BE DISSOLVED

ST. PAUL, Nov. 6.—Attorney General McReynolds concluding his final arguments for the dissolution of the International Harvester company before the federal district court today, asked that an interlocutory decree be entered declaring the harvester concern a monopoly in restraint of trade and that the defendants be given a reasonable time to submit a proper plan for its reorganization. "It is the government's view that the company must be cut into separate and distinct units" said McReynolds. "This must be done in such a way that the stockholders of the different parts will be distinct. We insist it is an impossibility for companies owned by the same people to furnish a bona fide competition." "McReynolds scored Cyrus McCormick, who he called the founder of the harvester trust, because McCormick did not appear in the case.

SHIP REACHES HOME PORT BUT ENTIRE CREW MISSING

NEW BEDFORD, Mass., Nov. 6.—The faded yellow pages of the log books of the New Bedford whaling fleet never recorded a sea mystery more baffling than that presented today when the revenue cutter Gresham towed in port the fishing schooner Annie M. Parker picked up Monday with all sails set, her hold filled with fish and without a soul aboard, sixty miles east of the Nantucket lightship, and no trace of the 19 men composing the crew. In its details the mystery recalls the case of the brig Marie Celeste, which was found abandoned at sea forty years ago. The fate of her crew remains unknown to this day.

JACK JOHNSON IS BARRED AS CHAMPION

PARIS, Nov. 6.—The International Boxing union tonight declared the world's heavyweight championship vacant on the grounds of Jack Johnson's conviction in the American courts and his repeated refusal to fight. Delegates were present from the United States, Belgium, Switzerland and France, and the action was taken with the approval of the English section of the union.

Donald says that Bud will be matched to fight Frankie Burns on Thanksgiving and that everything is fixed but Promoter Griffin's end of it.

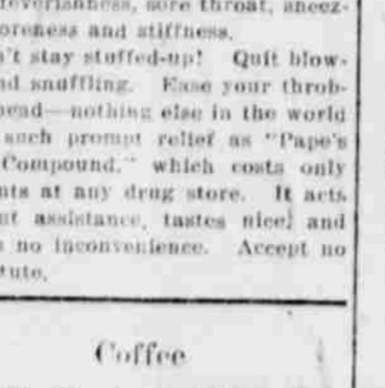

DOLLARHIDE ASKS \$4800 FOR TOLL ROAD

L. D. Dollarhide, owner of the toll road over the Siskiyou, was in conference with the county court Thursday relative to the proposed purchase of the road by the county, but his proposition was rejected.

Dollarhide asks \$300 a year for each of the sixteen years he has operated the road, or \$4800. A half mile of the road is needed in the Pacific highway, and if no agreement can be reached condemnation proceedings will be instituted by the county court.

There has been no annual report of business transacted filed by Dollarhide, in accordance to the law. He admits his profits this year were \$500, but that this is the first time the project paid. Three years ago he offered to sell the road to the county for \$2500.
