

## BRANDLEIS WRITES OF BREAKING POWER OF MONEY TRUST

NEW YORK, Nov. 12.—The first of a series of articles by Louis Brandeis, on "Breaking the Money Trust" will appear tomorrow in Harper's Weekly.

"The dominant element in our financial oligarchy is the investment banker," it will say. "The associated banks and trust and life insurance companies are his tools. The controlled railroads and public service and industrial corporations are his subjects."

"Though properly but middlemen, these bankers bestride the business world as masters, so that practically no large enterprise can be undertaken successfully without their participation and approval."

"The key to their power is combination and concentration, intensive and comprehensive."

The article will then describe the development of investment banks naming as pre-eminent among such concerns the houses of Morgan and Company, Drexel and Company, Lee Higginson and Company, Peabody and Company, and Kuhn, Loeb and Company.

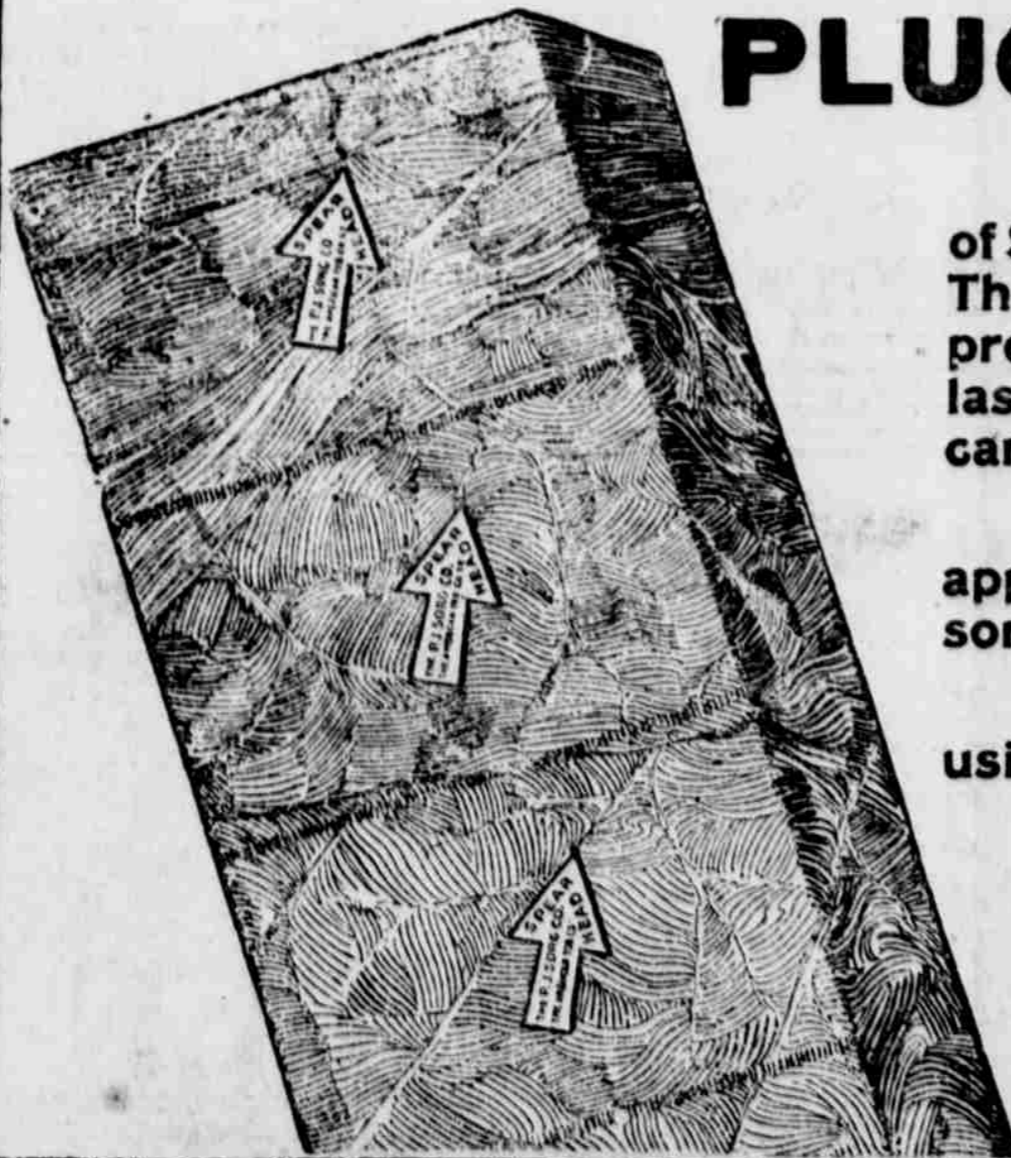
