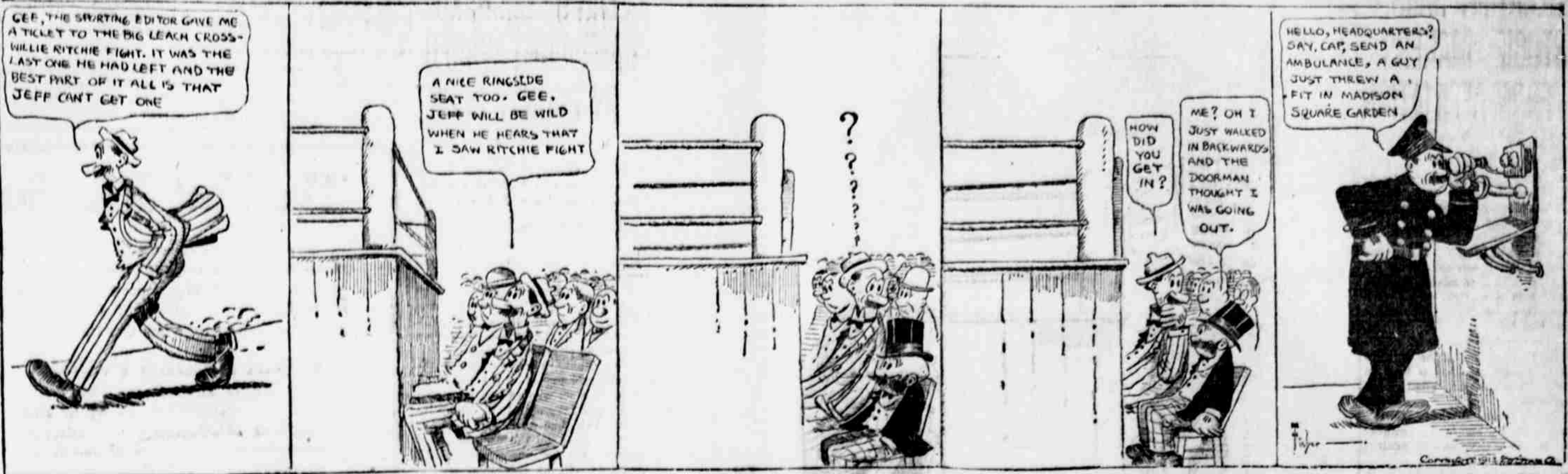


Oh, Sure, Jeff Saw the Ritchie-Cross Fight
