

### FEDERATION BARS STOGIE MAKERS FROM AFFILIATION

SEATTLE, Nov. 19.—After a sharp encounter between Delegate H. P. Corcoran, representing the stogie makers of Wheeling, W. Va., and delegates of the Cigarmakers' union, the right to affiliate with the American Federation of Labor was denied to the Stogie makers' league today and they were advised to continue efforts to amalgamate with the Cigarmakers' union. The debate lasted two hours.

It is charged by the stogie makers that the Cigarmakers' union does not want to amalgamate and is bent on keeping the stogie makers out of the federation.

President Gompers, who is a cigar maker, made it known by remarks from the chair that he was against a charter being granted.

Passage of the seaman's full crew bill was unanimously urged by the federation. A rider to this resolution calling for a vote of thanks to United States Senator La Follette for his efforts in behalf of the bill was stricken out by the committee to avoid setting a precedent.

### COUNCIL CHANGES WATER METER RATE

The city council Tuesday night took action on the water question by removing ambiguity from the section of the ordinance governing meter rates. This was accomplished by inserting the word "all," wiping away any double interpretation. The rates were not changed.

The rates now read:

Minimum charge, \$1.50 per month for 5000 gallons or less.

All over 5000 gallons, 12 cents per 1000 gallons; all over 50,000 gallons, 8 cents per 1000 gallons.

The ordinance originally read:

Minimum charge, \$1.50 per month for 5000 gallons or less; over 5000 gallons, 12 cents per 1000 gallons; over 50,000 gallons, 8 cents per 1000 gallons.

Yet he is not married at the age of forty-six. Now, however, the rumor is rife in Washington—society guesses it is much more than a rumor—that he is to wed Mrs. Thomas F. Walsh, widow of the Colorado mining king, who isn't worth a cent less than \$40,000,000. In addition she is the grand-

### CLEAN-UP ORCHARD CAMPAIGN FAVORED BY COUNTY COURT

At an adjourned meeting of the county court held Wednesday, a delegation consisting of J. A. Perry and F. H. Madden, representing the fruit growers of the valley, presented the recommendations submitted by the committee appointed at the Medford mass meeting recently held, praying for the inauguration of a thorough clean-up campaign of the orchards of the valley and requesting the appointment of additional inspectors during the clean-up campaign.

The county court authorized the temporary increase of the inspection force to nine, who will be appointed by County Inspector J. W. Myers, to serve such time as is found necessary to clean up the orchards, and authorized a vigorous campaign. All orchards will be inspected, owners notified of infection, and failure to clean up in reasonable time will be followed by condemnation and cutting down of infected trees and the placing of a lien upon the orchard to pay for the work.

The court purchased a \$1500 safe for the treasurer's office.
