### OFFICERS SEEKING ARTIST EARLE

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—Officers armed with warrants charging kidnapping were awaiting today here and in Boston the arrival of the trans-Atlantic liners Marquette and Finland, on one of which it is believed they would find Ferdinand Pinney Earle, Charlotte Herman, his affinity No. 3 and Earle's 9-year-old son by his first wife, whom the pair are accused of having stolen from a French boarding school.

The first Mrs. Earle is a French woman, and when she and Earle parted she took their son, and as soon as he was old enough put him in a boarding school near Paris. He disappeared from there some time ago, and on receiving an appeal from his frantic mother the police unearthed evidence indicating that he had left with his father.

They asked his arrest and extradition on a kidnapping charge. In addition to this he will be amenable to New York law if he lands here with a kidnapped person, and still further, residents of Monroe, N. Y., his home town, were preparing tar and feathers for him if he returned there.

### REAMES TRYING IMPORTANT LAND SWINDLING CASE

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 24.—The most important trial that United States Attorney Calrence L. Reames has had since he took office last June will begin next Monday afternoon when the case of J. T. Conway and Frank Richet, Portland promoters, charged with use of the mails to defraud, will come on for hearing before Judge Bean.

Conway and Richet were indicted in March of 1912, but the continued ill health of Richet has kept the case from coming up for trial until this time. As the principal members of the Oregon Inland Development company they are charged with the overexploitation of the Hyde-Benson-Veason school lands.

Witnesses from nearly every state west of the Mississippi river have been summoned by the government and they have begun to arrive. Between 50 and 60 witnesses on hand today were people from Kansas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Minnesota, Iowa and California.

Some of the land involved is in Jackson county—snow clad mountain peaks sold as farms.

The Orindale Addition to Klamath Falls was promoted by the defendants. It is six miles from Klamath Falls, by the present road, and four or five miles in an air course. This was platted more than a year ago and accepted by the county court and filed as an addition to Klamath Falls. Considerable criticism was heard of the county court when the map of this addition was accepted as not only its distance, but the character of the land makes it absolutely worthless as an addition to the city for homes or any other purpose.

feriority of the stuff marketed, when an occasional prime load of steers or cows appeared in the yards, order buyers snapped them up quickly at top prices. A steer sale Monday at \$7.75 and a load of two at \$7.40 and \$7.50 is an example, but the bulk of sales were at \$7.00 and \$7.25. The poorest lot of cows and heifers seen here for weeks caused the session to drag. Killers are simply oversupplied on poor beef quality. Other butcher lines were steady.

Hogs—The hog market faltered on Tuesday when the trade weakened about ten cents, but during the remainder of the period \$8.00 proved to be a substantial price basis for choice lightweight swine. A big volume of business was transacted Monday and Wednesday. Monday had the second largest single day's sale of the year, but live pork outlet seems to be broad enough to absorb liquidation to date.

Sheep—The sheep house furnished some excitement Monday when a few decks of fancy lambs sold at \$6.00, a new record for the season. Other varieties brought \$5.50 and \$5.75. Nothing sensational visited the mutton division, as most of the transactions consisted of medium grade ewes selling around \$3.65 and \$3.75. Prime ewes sold at \$4.00. Best yearlings are considered steady at \$4.75 and \$4.90; sold sheep \$4.50.

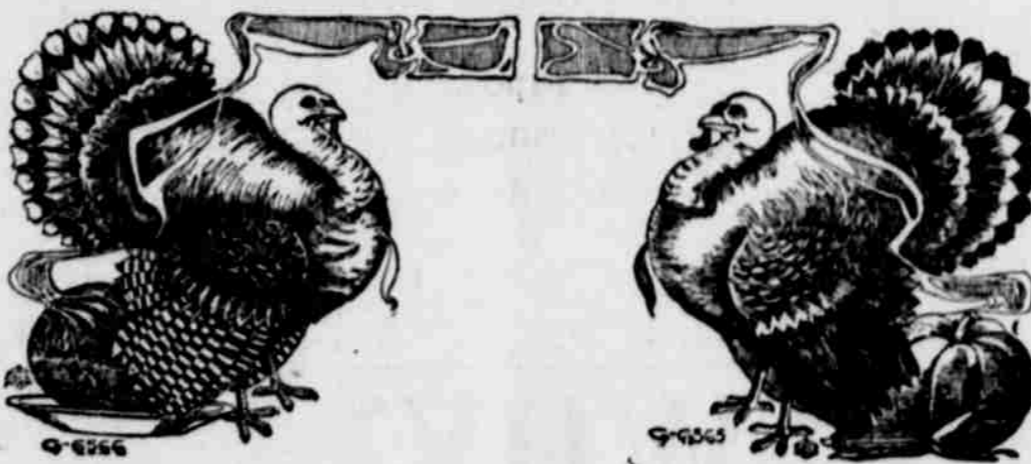
