**CHINESE THUGS
 TORTURE WIVES
 OF MISSIONARIES**

PEKIN, Nov. 29.—The sufferings
 and anxieties endured by the little
 colony of American and Norwegian
 missionaries, captured and for many
 days held prisoners by Chinese band-
 its at Ysao-Yang, were described
 graphically today by the Rev. H. S.
 Fauske, just arrived here after a
 long overland journey from the scene
 of this harrowing experience.
 The bandits, under the notorious
 "White Wolf," as the Chinese call
 him, took Taso-Yang, Fauske said,
 and occupied it with no more than a
 skirmish.
 The mission was raided September
 26. The bandits not actually mal-
 treat the missionaries, but they sepa-
 rate husbands from wives and as
 neither knew the other's fate, they
 suffered agonies of fear for one an-
 other during the period of their cap-
 tivity.

**NUMBER PLAYERS BIG
 FOOTBALL TEAMS PLAN**

CHICAGO, Nov. 29.—Coach Stagg
 of the University of Chicago pre-
 dicted here today that before the end
 of the next season every prominent
 football team in the west would adopt
 the system of numbering players.
 Sport directors of nine big west-
 ern universities last night agreed at
 a conference to number the players
 in the first two games next season.
 Stagg was appointed to devise a code
 whereby the officials may inform the
 spectators the reason for various
 penalties.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Nov. 29.—A
 warrant for \$10,000 reward for the
 capture of John J. and James B. Mc-
 Namara, dynamiters of the Los An-
 geles Times building was drawn here
 today by State Controller Chambers.
 It was made payable to George B.
 Crichton of New York, who came here
 as the agent of Detective Wm. J.
 Burns.
