

BUSINESS METHODS SOUGHT BY GLYNN IN STATE AFFAIRS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—Legislators and governors attending the rivers and harbors convention were asked today by Governor Glynn of New York to aid in a national movement to utilize business methods and business men in running state governments.

Glynn explained that he believed he had solved the question of an efficient state government by selecting an unofficial committee of twenty-five prominent business men of New York state to assist him in conducting the state's affairs. It was learned that Governor Glynn's selections include Attorney William Oshorn, Cleveland Dodge, John Rockefeller Jr. and Thomas Mulvey, a banker.

Governor Glynn explained that the reason for the waste in the business of states was because properly equipped business men refused to accept office. Under his plan the business men give their time without compensation and were asked to standardize the departments and formulate efficiency rules.

PORTLAND STILL IN NORTHWEST LEAGUE

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 4.—Many delegates to the big baseball pow wow here yesterday at which it was decided to permit the Portland club of the Northwestern league to continue in the class B circuit, departed for their homes today. The expected clash between the Pacific Coast league and Northwestern officials failed to materialize, though the discussion of whether Portland is to have continuous baseball was thrashed out thoroughly.

The meeting resulted in the Coast league giving the Northwesterners the right to invade Portland in 1914, but it was intimated that the permission would be denied in 1915. The minutes remained in session three hours.

President Baum of the Coast league, Jack Cook and Judge W. W. McCrosbie were appointed a committee to draw up the schedule for next year.

BATTLE NEAR AT TAMPICO-CONGRESS ANNULS ELECTION

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3. A big battle seemed imminent at Tampico today between strong forces of Mexican rebels and federals.

Having approved General Huerta's acts as president and dictator, Mexico's congress was expected to annul the last election this afternoon and perhaps ratify a big railroad concession to a Belgian company.

Mexico City diplomats smiled at Huerta's boast that he would stick to his post for a year, believing he knows as well as anyone that his regime's end is near.

Reports that Queen Mikhelina of Holland had offered to mediate in Mexico and that Huerta had refused were skeptically received.

It developed that when British oil producers cancelled their contracts to supply the Mexican National Railways with fuel, they did it merely to please the rebels and that the cau-

ways will continue to get their fuel oil.

News that Antonio Caballero, north Mexican millionaire, had been shot for plotting against the rebels, produced a painful impression among Mexican City officials, who feared their turn would come next.

President Wilson's message to congress was suppressed at Vera Cruz.

General Villa announced that he and his rebel forces would open Chihuahua city tonight or tomorrow.

SUFFRAGISTS WRATH VENTED ON TUMULTY

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—The cold which kept President Wilson in the White house all of yesterday was reported better today. He will remain indoors, however, again today.

President Wilson's decision to remain at the White house caused more trouble for Joseph Tumulty, his private secretary. A committee named by the suffragist convention here to uphold President Wilson for his failure to mention suffrage in his recent message was compelled to vent its displeasure upon Tumulty.

MUNITION MAKERS HOLD UP UNCLE SAM

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—That a lobby of private manufacturers is outrageously overcharging the government for munitions of war, is revealed beyond successful contradiction in a table prepared by Colonel George Montgomery, commandant at Frankford arsenal, Philadelphia.

The figures indicate that the government can save from 20 to 50 per cent on army contracts running into millions of dollars annually, by increasing the capacity of the government arsenals and doing all of its own manufacturing of war materials.

The report shows that an order for ammunition given to Frankford arsenal instead of private manufacturers between July 1, 1912, and April 25, 1913, amounted to \$1,900,004.65, the government saved \$979,840.94, or nearly one half the amount of the order.
