PUBLICITY AN ESSENTIAL OF GOVERNMENT

ELSEWHERE is published the estimate of the county court of county expenditures for the coming year, as authorized by the law recently enacted, so that protest may be made by any taxpayer in the fixing of tax levies for the year.

The laws also provide for publication monthly of all county expenditures as well as semi-annual reports from the offices handling public funds. These publications throw the limelight of publicity upon all county transactions and enable the taxpayers to keep track of public affairs.

The same principle should govern in city affairs. The council should publish each month a list of expenditures just as the county does. All ordinances should also be published.

Publicity allays distrust and suspicion and makes for harmony and for efficiency. Public officials are merely agents for the people and the people are entitled to complete knowledge of their own affairs.

When the city council succeeded in amending the charter so as to substitute telephone pole posting for newspaper publication it aroused suspicion.

If the council faces the recall, it can only blame itself, for whenever public officials become superior to the people, the latter are apt to assert their authority.

MITCHELL IN PRIME SHAPE FOR BATTLE

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Dec. 8.—Weighing exactly 135 1/2 pounds, half a pound above the mark at which he is to battle twenty rounds here Wednesday evening with Harlan Tommy Murphy, Willie Ritchie was pronounced by Manager Harry Foley to be in the best condition today of his career.
