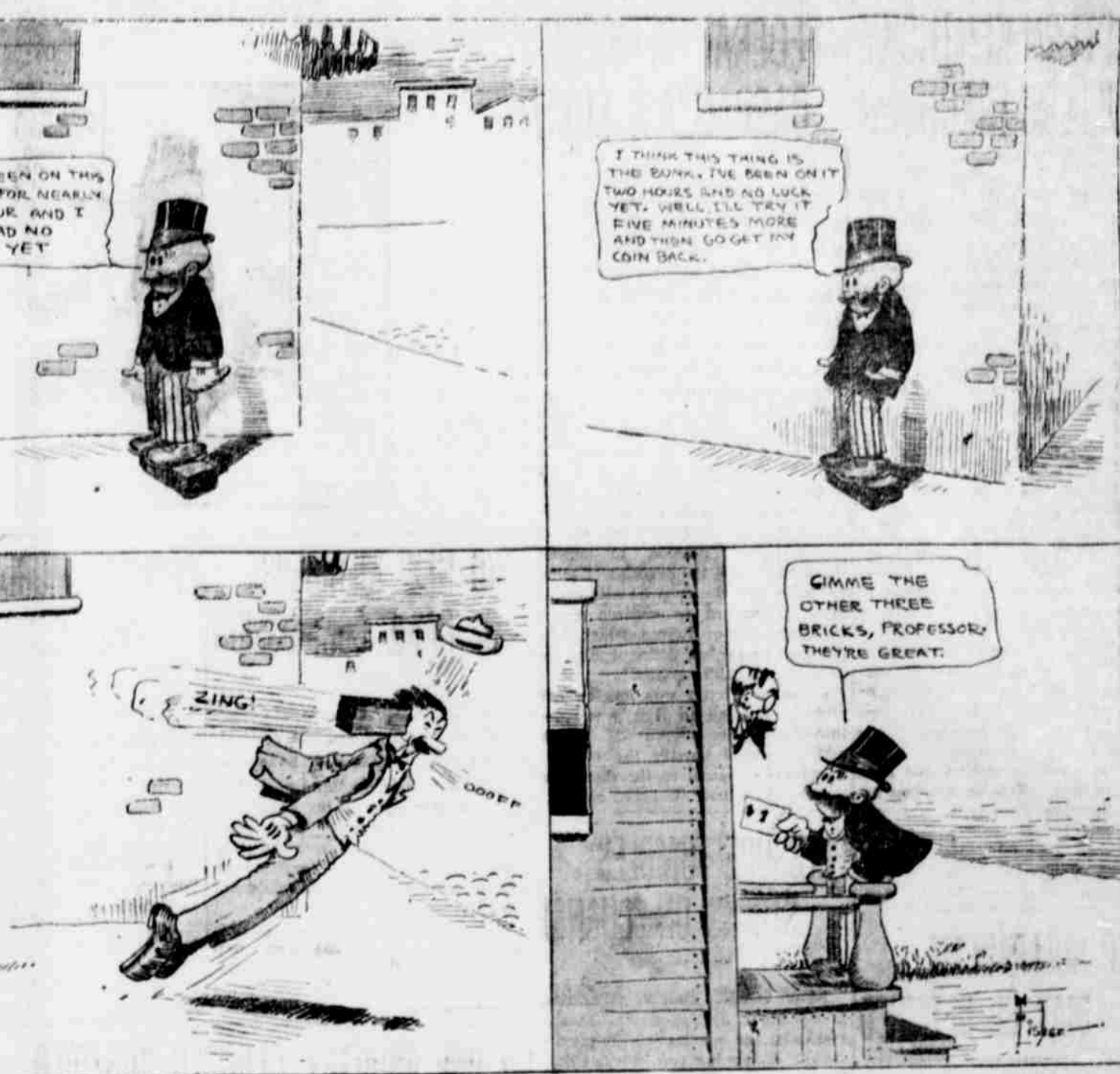
CADILLAC AUTOMOBILE WINS WORLD'S TROPHY
