

LANDLORDS AID DEFEATS LIBERALS IN BYE-ELECTIONS

LONDON, Dec. 13.—Wiping out a liberal majority of 1197 at the last previous election, W. Watson, conservative, won today the South Lancashire bye-election for a vacant seat in parliament, by a vote of 4257 to 4006 for his liberal opponent, G. Martin.

Not only did politicians take the result as indicative of the trend of public sentiment, but the liberals' parliamentary majority being narrow, it was pointed out that they could ill afford to lose even a single seat.

The situation was attributed partly to the landowners' bitter opposition to Chancellor of the Exchequer Lloyd George's land policy and partly to the liberals' support of Irish home rule, always unpopular in England.

TINKER WANTS \$10,000 TO PLAY IN EAST

CHICAGO, Dec. 13.—Joe Tinker, deposed manager of the Cincinnati club of the National league, discussed his sale to Brooklyn at a reported price of \$25,000.

"If it is true that I get \$10,000 of the purchase money paid to the Reds," said Tinker, "then I am perfectly willing to play in Brooklyn next year. Otherwise, I will stay right here in Chicago."

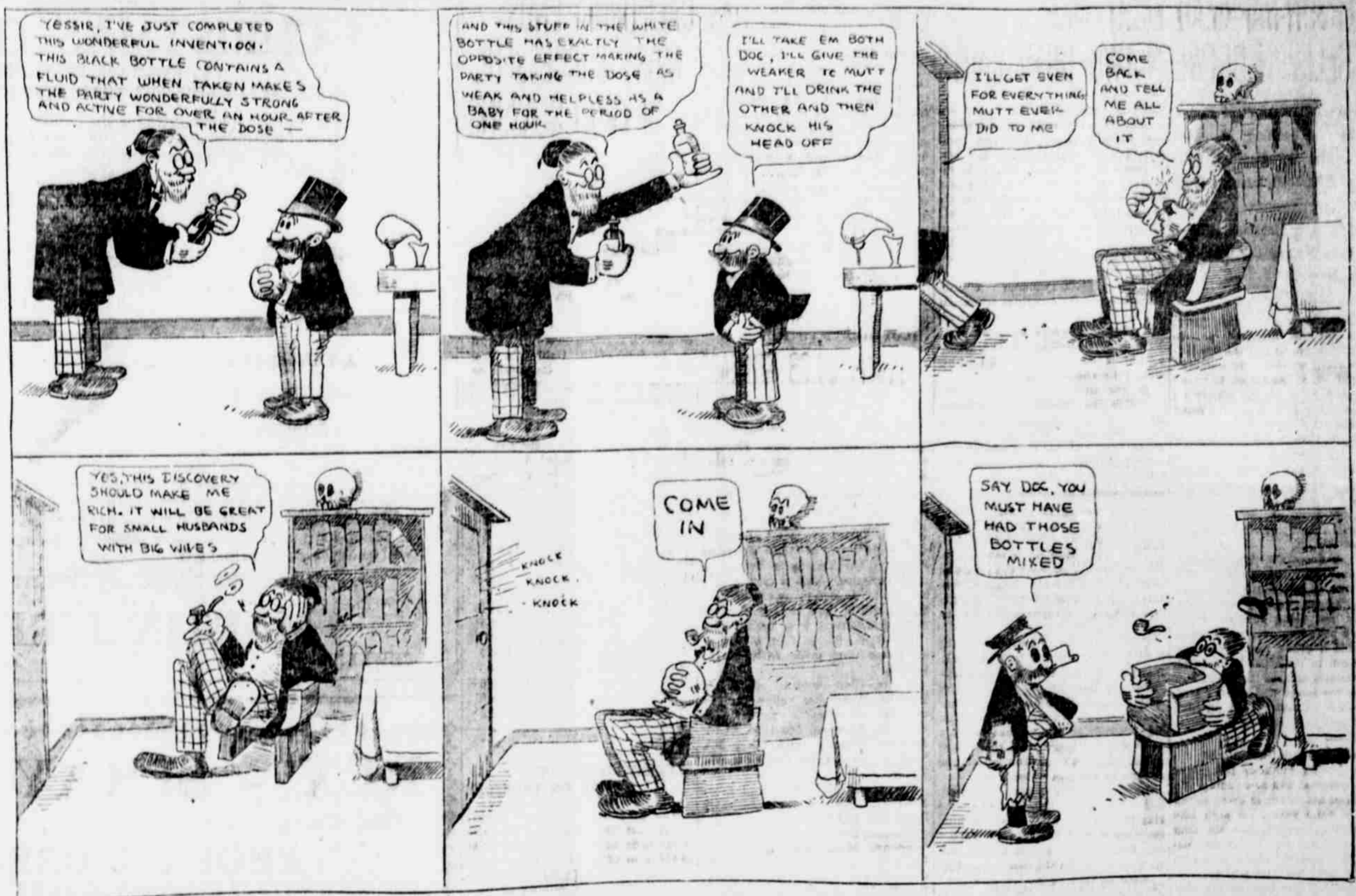
