

LONDON MARKET BETTER FOR APPLES THAN LIVERPOOL

Dennis & Son write under date of November 22:

London: Supplies of barrel pears this week are lighter, only about 2800 barrels coming forward by the Oceanic, Minnehaha and New York.

The Keiffer market remained flat during the earlier part of the week, owing to the large offerings last week and to the carrying over of a quantity of the better conditioned fruit from last week's arrivals. The major portion of the stock when offered was on the ripe side, parcels of firm green fruit being far to seek.

We are pleased to report, however, that during the latter part of the week we have noticed a much better feeling.

There have been a few Duchess pears on the market, but which have generally arrived in waxy condition, most of the barrels on being opened up showing a few rotten pears. Prices for these have been consequently low.

As regards fancy pears, the only variety arriving here in any quantity is Winter Nels. The trade for these is not so brisk as it was, at prices ranging from 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 per box.

Barrel apples continue in light supply, and the weather having turned colder, we are pleased to record a better feeling in American and Canadian stocks for good fruit.

Boxes of apples—Oregon Newtowns continue in plentiful supply but are a slow sale at prices ranging from 10s to 11 s 6d for the best counts.

Liverpool: The market for good barrel apples is if anything stronger than last week; supplies have been lighter, and there is a general advance in prices.

As regards boxes of Newtowns, Liverpool remains weak. Parcels which have already been on hand for some time continue to be passed at the auctions, sales are being effected slowly at 9s to 10s 6d, whilst Californians range around 7s 6d to 9s.

Keiffer pears show a slight advance, supplies being shorter, the condition of these remains unsatisfactory, however, there being still a large proportion of slack and waxy fruit. Fresh arrivals show an improvement in price.

It will be seen that there is a much better feeling generally in both markets this week, and whilst Liverpool is still the best market for barrel apples, London remains best for boxes and barrels of pears, and boxes of apples.

EQUADOR MENACED BY CONCHAS REVOLT

QUAYAQUIL, Ecuador, Dec. 16.—The stability of the Ecuadorian government was gravely menaced today by the spread of the revolutionary movement under General Conchas. The general captured Esmeraldas province yesterday. He has been gaining ground steadily for some time, and it was admitted in official circles, though not officially, that a point had been reached where the government will speedily fall unless he can be checked.

ARMY AND NAVY ANGER FOLLOWS BANQUET PROBE

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—Secretary of War Garrison was on the trail today of the authors of the songs and skits included in the entertainment at last Thursday's annual banquet of the Caribon society, which gave so much offense to President Wilson on account of the ridicule indulged in of the administration's Philippine policy.

At the secretary's demand, the men who had charge of the entertainment, turned over copies of all manuscripts used in connection with the program so that there will be no difficulty in determining who was responsible. No secret was made of the fact that the army head wants to see whether the offenders can be punished.

The society, consisting of army and navy officers who have served in the Philippines, Secretary of the Navy Daniels also was conducting an investigation in his department, though just what steps he has taken he did not make public.

To say that the officers whose conduct is being looked into are upset is to express it too mildly. Anger as well as anxiety was voiced by many of them. That their entertainment would be resented seemed never to have occurred to any of them. President Wilson's order for an investigation, with a view to possible reprimands, and his withdrawal from his recently accepted honorary membership in the society fell like a thunder-bolt.

Aside from his objection to the satirical references to his Philippine policy and to members of his cabinet, it was said the president considered the entire entertainment an undignified one for high military and naval officers to take part in.

THIRTY PERSONS KILLED IN AUSTRIAN WRECK

VIENNA, Dec. 16.—Thirty persons are reported killed and thirty-five seriously injured today in a railroad wreck near Darmow. An express train collided with a work train carrying 800 men. The cause of the wreck is not known.

SMALLEST REPUBLIC IS AGAIN AT ODDS WITH BIG KINGDOM

ROME, Dec. 16.—San Marino, the smallest, but nonetheless one of the most distinguished republics in the world is again at loggerheads with Italy. Recently the tiny republic passed a law obnoxious to the Vatican. The latter protested but San Marino refused to budge. Then the Vatican withdrew its minister and immediately thereafter San Marino withdrew its, and the two powers are still at odds.

A little later, San Marino solicited the gift from Italy of two antiquated cannon and at once increased its war footing by organizing an artillery corps of nine members. Later it was discovered that the republic was so small that there was no point within the kingdom where artillery practice could be indulged in without the cannon balls dropping in Italian territory and thus creating a hostile act. San Marino had no sooner apologized to Italy for this than she again started fresh trouble.

Like France, Italy and most of the other powers, San Marino exercises a government monopoly on tobacco from the sale of which it receives most of its state revenues. The government's supply is purchased from Italy and ordinarily amounts to a half ton a year.

In 1911, however, the San Marinos did not chew and smoke as much as ordinarily and San Marino purchased from Italy only a quarter of a ton of tobacco.

WILSON PROBE CALLED ACTION OF PEEVED COLLEGIAN

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—"The action of a peeved college president," was the way Representative Kahn of California, a member of the house military committee, characterized today President Wilson's resignation from the Caribon society.

"Every year in the principal universities," added Kahn, "the graduating class issues a class book full of digs at the faculty. Then the president calls the editors of the class book before him, admonishes them, and sometimes the editors are expelled for ruffling the dignity of the faculty."

"Well, President Wilson's action seems to be a parallel case. He may have taken similar steps toward Princeton students. There was no malice intended at the Caribon banquet."

"Now, with all the fuss and general attention given the 'Damn, Damn, Damn the Insurrectos' song it will become national property. I do not see why anyone should bother about the incident. It is too trifling."
